MOHAIR FOR EXPORT FROM THE UNITED STATES TO THE
REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

Effective July, 1998, mohair exported from the United States to the Republic of South Africa must be accompanied by an export document (VS 16-4) with the following certification statements:

1. Have been obtained from animals which are derived from an area where anthrax is not prevalent, and which is free from *foot-and-mouth disease, vesicular stomatitis, rinderpest, east coast fever, sheep scab, and sheep pox.*
2. Was stored under official veterinary supervision in an enclosed area for a minimum period of 30 days prior to export: AND
3. Is not matted or blood stained, and does not have any skin pieces adhering to it.
