Two immunological procedures that have the capacity to produce transient pain and/or distress in rabbit under this project protocol are: immunization of antigenic substances into subcutaneous sites on the shoulders and hips of the rabbit (to elicit serum antibody response), and periodic blood sampling from the marginal ear vein (to collect the elicited serum antibody).

For immunization, protein antigens are purified and transferred into a physiological buffer. This antigen is then emulsified into an adjuvant that proves the delivery of the target antigen to the immune system. The adjuvant/antigen mixture can cause localized inflammation at the sites of immunization that may be transiently tender and show signs of swelling.

For blood sampling, the rabbit's ear is shaven, cleaned and dilated (using d-limonine). Following this preparation, the marginal ear vein is nicked with a surgical or cosmetic razor blade. The blood sampling procedure is performed on a restrained rabbit and lasts approximately 15 minutes (from shaving until completed). After the sample has been collected the whole ear is washed with soapy water (to rinse off any dilatory substances) and the nick clots and blood flow stops. Vaseline is then applied to the shaven area to reduce itching.

## Protocols Containing IACUC Approved Exceptions

### 1. Routine Collection of Blood and Urine from Denning Bears

Fourteen black bears (*Ursus americanus*) are housed at the Carle Foundation Research Facility. These bears make it possible to study the physiologic and metabolic changes which occur during denning and apply that knowledge for the treatment of human diseases such as osteoporosis and renal failure. In the wild, during the natural denning season, black bears normally do not have access to food or even water, but are able to survive for as long as 5 to 7 months under these conditions without eating, drinking, urinating or defecating. In addition, female bears are able to give birth and nurse cubs while maintaining their winter fast. In order to stimulate the metabolic changes in captive black bears, it is necessary to reproduce the denning state as found in the wild. To do this, bears housed at the Carle Foundation Research Facility are fasted for 4-5 months, but have free access to water. The bears are observed daily by the caretaker and at least once a month by a veterinarian. Serum chemistries, which are performed periodically, also used to monitor the health status of the animals.

### 2. Summer Fasted Bears

Fourteen black bears would be fasted for up to 22 days during the non-denning season in order to compare ordinary fasting with the physiologic and metabolic changes observed during the winter months. Water would be allowed *ad libitum*. The bears would be observed daily by the caretaker and at 2 weeks by a veterinarian. Serum chemistries would also be used to monitor the health status of the animals.

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


