An exception to the regulations and standards was a six-dog study that involved limiting the cage size and exercise for canines post-surgically for approximately two weeks following an implant study.

Fourteen dogs were exempted from exercise under an approved IACUC protocol. Radioisotopes were administered to the animals requiring the animals to remain in their cages in order to collect urine, blood and stool samples. During this time (seven days), the animals were not allowed out of their cages to exercise. After completion of the study, the dogs were allowed to exercise daily in a confined area in order to contain any residual radioactivity they may excrete while outside their cages. Once it was determined that the amount of radioactivity in the dogs' urine and feces fell below approval limits, the dogs were returned to the general pool.

This experiment determines the effectiveness of new antibiotics in the treatment of Legionella disease. Guinea pigs are infected via intratracheal injection with *L. pneumophila*. One day after infection, they are treated with antibiotics currently used in treatment, saline solution alone, or the test antibiotic. The treatments are given for 2 to 5 days and the animals observed for a subsequent 5 day period. Efficacy of the test antibiotic is compared with the currently used antibiotics.

No analgesia is given immediately postsurgical period, or later, for several reasons:

- a.) There is no observable animal distress in the immediate postoperative period. The animals awaken from anesthesia within a few hours, then are normally active, eating and drinking normally.
- b.) There is little observable evidence of distress in ill animals, other than tachypnea, as the animals tend to become lethargic as they become ill.
- c.) The stress of injections may affect survival.

- d.) Any depression of respirations by analgesic agents could be fatal in these animals with pneumonia.
- e.) Since death is not used as an endpoint, clinical observation of the degree of illness, as well as weight and temperature, are used as indices of the degree of pneumonia. It is possible that analgesia could obscure important clinical signs, or even that it could induce lethargy - which is normally a good marker of severe pneumonia.

Unfortunately, there are no reliable subjective or objective clinical findings which can predict the likelihood of death before a point of severe illness in the animals. Therefore, it is necessary to use very severe illness as an endpoint, rather than an earlier time point. Some journal reviewers have even criticized the present severe illness endpoint, demanding an endpoint of death as being more objective. I am certain that the reliability of the animal data would be justifiably attacked were I to use an earlier time point than my present one.

The following provides an explanation of the procedures producing pain or distress and the reasons anesthetic, analgesic or tranquilizing drugs were not used. During the current reporting period, sixteen (16) out of a total of 188 rabbits were classified as "Category E".

Four (4) of the rabbits were on a 48 hour study to examine the irritation potential of a candidate pharmaceutical when given by the intravenous route or if a misinjection was given to humans. These animals experienced varying degrees of irritation to the ears including discoloration, redness, swelling and minor scabbing. No animals had open areas or self-traumatized. Treatment with anesthetics, analgesics or tranquilizers was not performed because the administration of an agent to these animals (1) would have confounded the scientific interpretation of the biological data derived from these studies, (2) was not indicated by the clinical signs observed, and (3) would likely have interfered with the assessment of the irritation potential of the pharmaceutical being tested.

Twelve (12) of the rabbits were on two studies of a candidate pharmaceutical examining the potential cardiac effects after a single dose infusion. The candidate pharmaceutical was an anti-tumor agent. Three of these animals were found dead soon after or during dosing with clinical signs of clonic convulsions, labored respirations, prostration and decreased heart rate. No treatment was administered due to the nature of the study and because death occurred immediately following the observance of the adverse clinical signs. Two animals were found dead on Day 2 of the study, the first with clinical signs of decreased activity, decreased heart rate and prostration and the second with a clinical sign of few feces. Again, no treatment was administered due to the nature of the study and because death occurred immediately following the observance of the adverse clinical signs. One animal was euthanized in moribund condition on Day 5 of the study with clinical signs of prostration, decreased activity, few feces and labored respiration. The remaining six animals showed clinical signs of decreased activity, ataxia, rapid respiration and decreased appetite but were not considered to be moribund. These animals were not treated with anesthetics, analgesics, tranquilizers or other agents at the time of clinical signs because administration would have confounded the scientific interpretation of the biological data derived from these studies and would likely have interfered with the assessment of the effects of the pharmaceutical being tested. Animals which required some support were supplemented with special diet and/or fluids.

Other animals originally classified in the E category at the time of protocol approval and study initiation due to the uncertainty as to compound effects have been reclassified in this report in the C or D category due to the absence of any pain or distress requiring treatment with analgesics, anesthetics or tranquilizers or due to the appropriate treatment being given.

## EXEMPTION FROM FEEDING STANDARD

Explanation of the procedures for which anesthetics will not be given.

Since we are studying the nutritional and energetic signals that control reproduction, in some of our experiments, animals are food restricted or fasted. During fasting or food restriction, no anesthesia or analgesics are given because the animals are not in pain or distress. However, despite the fact that the animals are not in pain or distress, we have been asked to fill in the number of animals that are food restricted or fasted in the space labeled "E" on Interagency Report Control NO. 01800-DOA-AN.

In our experiments, hamsters are food restricted or fasted to the extent that estrous cycles are interrupted but are not restricted further. When animals are fasted or food restricted, effects on fertility and ovulation occur long before any other adverse health consequences (Merry and Holehan, 1979; Merson and Kirkpatrick, 1981, Bronson, 1989). This is because animals have a sensory system designed to detect internal energy availability (Schneider, 1992). The sensory detectors of fuel availability send signals to parts of the brain that control fertility and ovulation as well as those areas that control hunger, food intake and caloric homeostasis. My experiments are designed to study the mechanisms that underlie this link between energy and fertility. Thus, in most experiments, hamsters are fasted to a degree that induces infertility and anestrus, but not to a degree that causes health problems. This is possible because fertility is affected prior to any effect on general health. All of the available information on the effects of food deprivation in Syrian hamsters comes from work in my own laboratory or in the laboratories of Drs. George N. Wade and Lawrence P. Morin. For example, Dr. Morin (Morin, 1975; 1986) found that a 48 hour fast, but not a 24 or 36 hour fast, on days 1 and 2 of the estrous cycle induced anestrus, but this fast had no other health effects. NOTE: Hamsters have a 4-day estrous cycle with ovulation and estrous behavior occurring on Day 4. One important piece of evidence demonstrating that a 48 h of fast is not harmful to Syrian hamsters is that when the 48 hour fast occurs on Days 2 and 3, Days 3 and 4, or on Days 4 and 1 of the cycle, there is no effect on estrous cyclicity (the hamsters showed normal ovulation rates and vigorous sex behavior). Ovulation and estrous behavior are inhibited only when the fast occurs on Days 1 and 2 of the estrous cycle, but not on any other days. Morin also found that normal estrous behavior could be easily reinstated in the 48 hour fasted hamsters by giving an injection of estradiol. Furthermore, the effects on estrous cyclicity are rapidly reversed when the hamsters are returned to ad lib feeding. I subsequently demonstrated that the same 48 hour fast had no effect on estrous cyclicity or health in previously fattened hamsters (Schneider and Wade, 1989, Schneider and Wade, 1990). Thus, a 48 hour fast has no effect on estrous cyclicity whatsoever when the hamsters have a high body fat content. In general, the fatter the hamster, the longer the period of food restriction necessary to induce anestrus. As long as the hamsters have been fed ad libitum prior to the 48 h fast, there is little effect on fertility. Again, it is critical to understand that the effects on fertility occur prior to any generalized health problems. In my experiments, the most extreme form of caloric restriction will be a 60 h fast that occurs on days 1 and 2 of the estrous cycle. Body weight is recorded and general health condition is monitored daily. In addition to a fasted group, other groups will be fasted and injected (or infused) with metabolic fuels or nutrients to examine their role in maintenance of normal reproductive function. Hamsters in the laboratory tend to

become obese as they grow older. In some experiments, obese hamsters will be restricted to 85% of their ad libitum intake for up to one week prior to the start of the experiment to insure that they are not too fat, but still show normal estrous cycles and no signs of poor health.

Analgesics are not appropriate because we are measuring indices of estrous cyclicity which is under control of hypothalamic luteinizing hormone releasing hormone (LHRH), also known as gonadotropin releasing hormone (GnRH). LHRH and LH levels are adversely affected by opiates because it is well-known that opiates and opiate derivatives, including analgesics such as buprenorphine, butorphenol and morphine, affect pituitary hormone secretion and hypothalamic LHRH (GnRH) secretion (2-12).

The following provides an explanation of the procedures producing pain or distress and the reasons anesthetic, analgesic or tranquilizing drugs were not used. During the current reporting period, sixteen (16) out of a total of 188 rabbits were classified as "Category E".

Four (4) of the rabbits were on a 48 hour study to examine the irritation potential of a candidate pharmaceutical when given by the intravenous route or if a misinjection was given to humans. These animals experienced varying degrees of irritation to the ears including discoloration, redness, swelling and minor scabbing. No animals had open areas or self-traumatized. Treatment with anesthetics, analgesics or tranquilizers was not performed because the administration of an agent to these animals (1) would have confounded the scientific interpretation of the biological data derived from these studies, (2) was not indicated by the clinical signs observed, and (3) would likely have interfered with the assessment of the irritation potential of the pharmaceutical being tested.

Twelve (12) of the rabbits were on two studies of a candidate pharmaceutical examining the potential cardiac effects after a single dose infusion. The candidate pharmaceutical was an anti-tumor agent. Three of these animals were found dead soon after or during dosing with clinical signs of clonic convulsions, labored respirations, prostration and decreased heart rate. No treatment was administered due to the nature of the study and because death occurred immediately following the observance of the adverse clinical signs. Two animals were found dead on Day 2 of the study, the first with clinical signs of decreased activity, decreased heart rate and prostration and the second with a clinical sign of few feces. Again, no treatment was administered due to the nature of the study and because death occurred immediately following the observance of the adverse clinical signs. One animal was euthanized in moribund condition on Day 5 of the study with clinical signs of prostration, decreased activity, few feces and labored respiration. The remaining six animals showed clinical signs of decreased activity, ataxia, rapid respiration and decreased appetite but were not considered to be moribund. These animals were not treated with anesthetics, analgesics, tranquilizers or other agents at the time of clinical signs because administration would have confounded the scientific interpretation of the biological data derived from these studies and would likely have interfered with the assessment of the effects of the pharmaceutical being tested. Animals which required some support were supplemented with special diet and/or fluids.

Other animals originally classified in the E category at the time of protocol approval and study initiation due to the uncertainty as to compound effects have been reclassified in this report in the C or D category due to the absence of any pain or distress requiring treatment with analgesics, anesthetics or tranquilizers or due to the appropriate treatment being given.

The four dogs listed in Column E for this reporting year were assigned to a Column D ranked study that involves the absorption, distribution, metabolism and elimination of new chemical entities. After being administered a single dose of compound, the four dogs unexpectedly developed acute diarrhea containing blood and mucous. The animals were responsive, yet somewhat depressed, for no longer than 48 hours after the first signs appeared. The veterinarian providing oversight to the study felt that the condition was experimentally induced intestinal disease. The animals continued to drink water and were considered adequately hydrated during the entire study. It was felt that any therapy to firm the stool would not be particularly effective and the scientist did not want this used. Administration of other analgesics or other supportive therapy was thought to potentially interfere with the study.

The veterinarians and IACUC feel that these dogs experienced "more than slight or momentary pain or distress", as defined in the *Animal Welfare Act*. Even though no additional analgesics were provided, it was agreed that the remaining pharmacokinetic portion of the study could continue. The veterinarian and scientist closely monitored the dogs until the animals returned to normal within 72 hours.

## COLUMN E EXPLANATION

**Facility Registration No: 23-R-0061**

**Rabbits:** The one hundred sixty-seven rabbits listed in Section E of the Annual Report were used in EPA or OECD ocular or dermal irritation studies in which the use of anesthetics has the potential to mask or worsen the responses being investigated. The purpose of these studies is to determine the irritant or corrosive effect of a substance when applied to the skin or eye. In cases where we have reason to believe that ocular or dermal reactions may be severe, we recommend to the study sponsor that only one rabbit be tested. In cases where the reaction is unexpectedly severe, the sponsor is notified and the animals are humanely sacrificed to avoid further pain.

**Guinea Pigs:** The four hundred thirteen guinea pigs listed in Section E were used on Magnusson-Kligman sensitization evaluations which are required under OECD testing guidelines preferred in Europe and used by sponsor's pursuing a global market for their product. The initial inductions used for these studies involve the use of Freund's Complete Adjuvant, which produces irritant reactions. The purpose of this study is to assess the sensitization potential of a substance following repeated dermal exposure. This is a regulatory driven protocol and there are no provisions in the test guideline to permit the use of analgesia or anesthetics.


