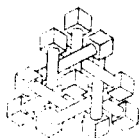

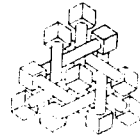

Explanation for animals classified under Item E of APHIS Form 7023:

There were 38 dogs noted in the "pain and distress without treatment" category because they were administered test articles that caused pain or distress, or interfered with normal functions because of their composition. All of these animals were involved in safety assessment toxicology studies for novel pharmaceutical candidate compounds. These animals variably experienced episodes of emesis, diarrhea, lethargy, and/or reduced appetite associated with administration of the test article. The reason for withholding tranquilizers, analgesics, anesthetics or other metabolically active therapeutic agents was that their use would have confounded the meaningful interpretation of both pharmacokinetic and drug-induced toxicity data. Prior to approval of the use of a drug or biological agent in humans, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) requires submission of pharmacokinetic and drug-induced toxicity data derived from both rodent and non-rodent mammalian species (Reference: 21 CFR, Part 312, 4-1-95).

Eleven non-human primates were on studies using controlled water intake. Water was withheld overnight prior to testing. Animals received water and/or juice during testing and had free access to water for several hours following testing. Animals were weighed regularly while on study with no ill effects observed. The maximum continuous period of controlled water intake was five days for most animals; two animals experienced two periods of six days and another animal experienced five periods of six days. All other animals had unlimited access to water at least two days each week.

Light cycles in lemming housing areas were designed to mimic natural environmental conditions. Animals received short periods of light or dark depending on the season being studied. The rooms were 8 hours light/16 hour dark, or 16 hours light/8 hours dark, or 22 hour light/2 hours dark.

In the third study, the investigator is studying the hormonal modulation of nitric oxide generation (the three year approval period of this protocol expired on 10/31/03 so this is no longer an active protocol). Sheep are administered endotoxin as a component of these evaluations.

In regards to the two sheep studies investigating appetite regulation: The following information, provided by the Principal Investigator, was approved by the IACUC . "Treatment for endotoxin will not be provided until after the data are collected. The purpose of the study is to examine the effects of endotoxin on appetite. Use of a treatment for symptoms will interfere with the effects of endotoxin on appetite."
