Non-human primates were injected with MPTP to induce signs of Parkinson disease. Animals received careful monitoring and supportive care, but the development of neurological signs was a necessary feature of this animal model.

The only IACUC approved exception to USDA regulations and the Guide was to allow water restriction for non-human primates on a behavioral study of cognitive/motor function. The IACUC has established written guidelines for this procedure.



##### (3) Litter

A litter exemption was approved for 331 adult felines participating on stool quality, digestibility, and urine pH trials. The litter exemption was granted to eliminate the possibility of contamination of specimens in studies involving the collection of feces and/or urine.

#### Section 3.9 Feeding

(a) Diets must be uncontaminated, wholesome, palatable, and of sufficient quantity and nutritive value to maintain the normal condition and weight of the animal.

An exemption to allow test diets for gestation/lactation studies and maintenance studies to be fed longer than six months past the milling date. The purpose of these studies is to prove the nutritional adequacy of the test diet on gestation and lactation or maintenance based on AAFCO feeding protocols. The exemption was approved for 914 canines on gestation and lactation studies, 111 canines on maintenance studies, 6 canines on growth studies, 50 canines on customized studies, 16 felines on maintenance studies, and 32 felines on customized studies. This equals 1081 total canines and 48 total felines.
