

RECORDS	A traveling exhibitor must have required records available for review during an inspection on the road.
Required Records	<p>The following records, when applicable, must be available for review during an inspection on the road:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • acquisition records or a record of animals on hand for all regulated animals present [2.75(a) and (b)] • disposition records for all regulated animals that have left the current tour since it began. [2.75(a) and (b)] <p>Note: If an animal dies or is euthanized while on tour:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ the date of death must be recorded ➤ details of the death should be maintained in the medical records <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Program of Veterinary Care appropriate for the animals being exhibited [2.40(a)(1)] • Health Certificates for dogs/cats/nonhuman primate [2.78] <p>Note: It is recommended that an exhibitor in continuous travel obtain a new health certificate every 6 months.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exercise Plan for dogs [3.8] • Nonhuman Primate Environmental Enhancement Plan [3.81] • water quality records for marine mammals [3.106] • individual medical records for marine mammals [3.110(d)] • necropsy records for marine mammals [3.110] • current elephant TB testing results [2.40(b)(2)] <p>Note: Copies of the original records are acceptable.</p>
Recommended Records	<p>A traveling exhibitor should have the following records available, but may not be cited for a lack of them or as “stand-alone” citations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • license certificate • last on-the-road inspection report • health/medical records for all regulated animals present, such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ preventive medical treatments ➤ records pertinent to current problems and treatments

- records pertinent to existing chronic conditions
- necropsy records (other than marine mammals)
- noncommercial diet approval for large felids [Policy #25]
- proof of TB testing of the elephant handlers
Note: These records must exist but the exhibitor does not have to make them available to you.
- health certificates for all other regulated species
Note: This may be a State requirement. Refer the exhibitor to proper State agency if he/she has questions.
- itinerary

Note: Copies of the original records are acceptable.

**Availability
of Records**

A traveling exhibitor should have the records with him/her on the road. However, if the records are at another site or location, it is acceptable for the records to be e-mailed or faxed to the site of the inspection during the inspection. **It is NOT recommended that the inspector allow the records to be faxed to him/her at a later date.**

If the required records are not available, cite as a noncompliance under the appropriate Section.

A traveling exhibitor must have all the appropriate records for the regulated animals for up to one year from the disposal or euthanasia of the animals. [2.80(b)]
