ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

Sec. 2.40 Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

(a) Each dealer or exhibitor shall have an attending veterinarian who shall provide adequate veterinary care to its animals in compliance with this section.

(1) Each dealer and exhibitor shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements. In the case of a part-time attending veterinarian or consultant arrangements, the formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the dealer or exhibitor

Found need to have vet on premises for annual kennel visit, last date recorded was 4-27-05. Have left all vet care forms and a folder for keeping USDA records together. Place the Program of Vet Care ,Exercise Plan and Records Keeping Worksheet ,the 7005's, 7006's, all USDA information readily accessible for inspectors. Correct by 10-1-06

TIME AND METHOD OF IDENTIFICATION.

Sec. 2.50 Time and method of identification.

(a) A class "A" dealer (breeder) shall identify all live dogs and cats on the premises as follows:

(1) All live dogs and cats held on the premises, purchased, or otherwise acquired, sold or otherwise disposed of, or removed from the premises for delivery to a research facility or exhibitor or to another dealer, or for sale, through an auction sale or to any person for use as a pet, shall be identified by an official tag of the type described in Sec. 2.51 affixed to the animal's neck by means of a collar made of material generally considered acceptable to pet owners as a means of identifying their pet dogs or cats (2), or shall be identified by a distinctive and legible tattoo marking acceptable to and approved by the Administrator.

There are approximately 30 weaned pups less than 16 weeks of age needing to be identified. Owner does microchip all adults in the kennel .Am asking that these weaned pups be identified either by a 3x5" card posted at pens entrance ,giving date of birth and the Missouri ID number of each pup in the litter, blended litters ,a card for each litter or microchip these pups on the day of weaning .Transfer the Missouri ID number or the microchip number to the 7006 ,Record Of Disposition form.

3.4 (b) (3) (i)

OUTDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

(3) Be provided with a wind break and rain break at the entrance; and

(4) Contain clean, dry, bedding material if the ambient temperature is below 50 deg. F (10 deg. C). Additional clean, dry bedding is required when the temperature is 35 deg. F (1.7 deg. C) or lower.

There is need to install and maintain wind and rainbreak protection on every sheltered housing entrance whether it be a dog box or a plastic dog house. Have discussed this need with the owner today and there is evidence of protection being asked for on these shelters in the past because we saw at least a half dozen flaps fastened in the open position. Protection must be on in place and usable preventing drafts and blowing rain or turn the house entrances opposite of the pen front and toward the wall. Temperatures at night are in the 40's begin to use and maintain bedding when temperatures are lower than 50 degrees fahrenheit. Correct by 10-1-06

3.6 (a) (2) (iii)

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

(iii) Contain the dogs and cats securely;

(iv) Keep other animals from entering the enclosure;

Saw approximately 20-30 pens of large breed dogs able to extend body parts out side of the 6x6" cattle panel openings today. Reduce the opening size on pen fronts to 2"x4" size that will not allow dogs to project body parts outside of pen. Also this reduced mesh size should prevent the entry of any of any diseased skunk, opossum or racoon. This affects 50-60 large breed dogs.

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

(d) Pest control. An effective program for the control of insects, external parasites affecting dogs and cats, and birds and mammals that are pests, must be established and maintained so as to promote the health and well-being of the animals and reduce contamination by pests in animal areas.

Found several areas of mouse activity today, with a strong mouse urine odor. Found sack feed piled 2-3 high without a pallet under them. Use pallets for ventilation and light which will prevent attracting insects and rodents. Also saw in the north large dog facility a developing problem with roosting sparrows above dog feeders and occupied pen space of dogs. Recommend that serious thought and effort be given to preventing this disease carrier to exist. Correct by 10-1-06
