TIME AND METHOD OF IDENTIFICATION.

(1) All live dogs and cats held on the premises, purchased, or otherwise acquired, sold or otherwise disposed of, or removed from the premises for delivery to a research facility or exhibitor or to another dealer, or for sale, through an auction sale or to any person for use as a pet, shall be identified by an official tag of the type described in Sec. 2.51 affixed to the animal's neck by means of a collar made of material generally considered acceptable to pet owners as a means of identifying their pet dogs or cats \2\, or shall be identified by a distinctive and legible tattoo marking acceptable to and approved by the Administrator.

* Record of dogs on hand show approx. 15 dogs have not been microchipped. All dogs on the premise mustbe officially ld'd by either microchip, tattoo or collar means. This standard was not in compliance on 3-29-05 & on 9-30-05.


RECORDS: DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS.

(a)(1) Each dealer, other than operators of auction sales and brokers to whom animals are consigned, and each exhibitor shall make, keep, and maintain records or forms which fully and correctly disclose the following information concerning each dog or cat purchased or otherwise acquired, owned, held, or otherwise in his or her possession or under his or her control, or which is transported, euthanized, sold, or otherwise disposed of by that dealer or exhibitor.

* Record of dogs on hand was short the microchip numbers for 15 dogs. All Id information mustbe listed on the dog on hand sheets. This standard was not in compliance on 3-29-05 & on 9-30-05.

(2) Maintenance and replacement of surfaces. All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis. Surfaces of housing facilities--including houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures and objects within the facility--that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled.

* Middle building north half east side of this building, lenolin flooring was tron & missing in 2 of the east enclosures. Regular maintance is needed on all torn & missing lenolin flooring. Correct by 10-30-05.

FEEDING.

(b) Food receptacles must be used for dogs and cats, must be readily accessible to all dogs and cats, and must be located so as to minimize contamination by excreta and pests, and be protected from rain and snow. Feeding pans must either be made of a durable material that can be easily cleaned and sanitized or be disposable.

* One plastic feeder is broken to the point that it can no longer protect the dog feed from rain entering the feeder. Replacement of the feeder is needed affecting 2 dogs. Correct by 10-30-05.



WATERING.

If potable water is not continually available to the dogs and cats, it must be offered to the dogs and cats as often as necessary to ensure their health and well-being, but not less than twice daily for at least 1 hour each time, unless restricted by the attending veterinarian. Water receptacles must be kept clean and sanitized in accordance with Sec. 3.11(b) of this subpart, and before being used to water a different dog or cat or social grouping of dogs or cats.


* Noticed algae in several dog water pans & noticed dirty water due to the dogs jumping into there water pans affecting 40 dogs. General cleaning of all water pans is needed as often as necessary to prevent algae from building up. Correct by 10-14-05.
