OUTDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

***Shelters in outdoor facilities for dogs or cats must contain a roof, four sides, and a floor, and must:

- (1) Provide the dogs and cats with adequate protection and shelter from the cold and heat;***

The facility is currently constructing an additional sheltered housing area. This new construction has not been completed and is being used to house adult dogs. At the time of inspection the building has a roof and three sides. A door was not in place in the doorway on one of the three walls. No means of heating was being utilized in this building. These dogs have access to exterior runs and interior enclosures. The interior enclosures do not meet the requirements for a suitable shelter as they have a wire panel top and sides that do not reduce drafts and help conserve body heat. To provide for adequate shelter from the cold this construction should be finished and heat provided for these dogs. Adequate measures should be taken to reduce and/or eliminate drafts. PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

The interior height of a primary enclosure must be at least 6 inches higher than the head of the tallest dog in the enclosure when it is in a normal standing position: Provided That, prior to February 15, 1994, each dog must be able to stand in a comfortable normal position.

One pug female with litter was housed within the whelping trailer in an enclosure that provided less than four inches of head space while the female was in a normal standing position. All enclosures should provide at least 6 inches of free head space over the top of the dog's head while in a normal standing position. Affects one adult dog.

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using one of the methods prescribed in paragraph (b)(3) of this section, and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards.

Three enclosures within the whelping trailer have accumulations of brown organic matter along the wooden support structures of the enclosure. These accumulations are within contact of the adult females and puppies in these enclosures and pose disease and pest hazards to the animals. The two puppy cages at the rear of the trailer have fecal accumulations clinging to the wire mesh flooring surface. The puppies have trafficking in this feces and flattened the waste on the wire mesh. These accumulations pose disease, pest, and odor hazards to these puppies. All enclosures shall be thoroughly cleaned at least once every two weeks or as often as necessary to remove all organic matter from the enclosure. Affects 17 puppies and 3 adult dogs.

Excreta and food waste must be removed from primary enclosures daily, and from under primary enclosures as often as necessary to prevent an excessive accumulation of feces and food waste, to prevent soiling of the dogs or cats contained in the primary enclosures, and to reduce disease hazards, insects, pests and odors. When steam or water is used to clean the primary enclosure, whether by hosing, flushing, or other methods, dogs and cats must be removed, unless the enclosure is large enough to ensure the animals would not be harmed, wetted, or distressed in the process. Standing water must be removed from the primary enclosure and animals in other primary enclosures must be protected from being contaminated with water and other wastes during the cleaning. The pans under primary enclosures with grill-type floors and the ground areas under raised runs with mesh or slatted floors must be cleaned as often as necessary to prevent accumulation of feces and food waste and to reduce disease hazards pests, insects and odors.

The floor area beneath the puppy pens in the rear of the whelping trailer has accumulations of feces, hair, feed, and other debris. All floor areas shall be cleaned daily to reduce disease, odor, and rodent risks to the kennel area. The exercise area between the whelping trailer and the outside kennel runs has an excessive accumulations of feces. This area has not been spot cleaned in multiple days. This area should be spot cleaned with all feces removed at least once daily to eliminate odor, disease, and pest hazards. Affects 6 puppies and 77 adult dogs.

This inspection was conducted by the owner and Curt McGruder-ACI.
