**** The shaded are for the lions that is provided by the trees is not enough for the lions to have enough space away from the direct sunlight.

***The enclosure that contains the Sika deer is muddy; the dry area is too small. Need to establish better drainage system that alleviates this problem in accordance with the local laws and regulations.


