b) Shelter from inclement weather. Natural or artificial shelter appropriate to the local climatic conditions for the species concerned shall be provided for all animals kept outdoors to afford them protection and to prevent discomfort to such animals. Individual animals shall be acclimated before they are exposed to the extremes of the individual climate.

***Seven elk and 13 sika deer are in a large pasture area that does not have a way for the hoofstock to get out of the wind. Some method of providing a windbreak needs to be implemented so these animals are protected from discomfort.

(c) Drainage. A suitable method shall be provided to rapidly eliminate excess water.

***The enclosure housing two approximately one year old tigers was several inches deep with a soupy mud. The tigers could get out of the mud by entering their enclosure, but there was no other way to escape the deep mud. Heavy rains had fallen for two days prior to the inspection, but some method of drainage or other way to keep the enclosure from getting into such a state needs to be employed.
