

3.127(d) Facilities Outdoor. Perimeter. The fence must be constructed so that it protects the animals in the facility by restricting animals and unauthorized persons from going through it or under it and having contact with the animals in the facility, and so that it can function as a secondary containment system for the animals in the facility.....

A survey of the perimeter fence surrounding the zoo grounds revealed approximately 25 acres where there is sufficient space at the bottom of the fence to allow animals from the outside to enter the zoo grounds. The north side midway down the hill was a large gap at the bottom of the fence the rebar had been ripped aside and fur was attached to the fence. There were also some areas where the tree branches had grown over the fence, potentially allowing animals to gain access to the grounds via the branches. The maintenance personnel marked each of the areas in question with orange tape.

Inspection was limited to PPEQ inspection, African Rift and Backyard Petting Zoo.


