FACILITIES, GENERAL.**

<<<<The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair....>>>>

The fence on the southeast side of the middle brown bear pen in the drive-through area is still deteriorating and rusty with broken wires in some areas. This area was included in the non-compliance documented on June 3, 2003. The fencing for all areas where rust with deterioration is occurring was to be completed by Sept. 30, 2003.

**3.127 (d) REPEAT NCI
FACILITIES, OUTDOOR.**

There is still no perimeter fence around the hoofstock areas, as required by regulation. This requirement was discussed with the licensee on Jan. 9, 2003. Written guidelines for this regulation and request for variance was sent to licensee with the inspection report of 12/17/02, and again with the inspection report for June 9, 2003. The correction date was Aug. 31, 2003. A letter requesting a variance for this requirement was dated Sept. 8, 2003. The variance request was not granted by the Western Regional Office. A second letter requesting a variance was dated Oct. 10, 2003. The variance request was not granted by the Western Regional Office. These letters were written and sent after the date for correction had passed, and no request for an extension of the correction date was done by the licensee.

WATERING.**

<<<<All water receptacles shall be kept clean and sanitary.>>>>

The water receptacles for the rhinoceros and the elk have abundant green algae growth along the inner sides and muddy buildup in the bottoms of the troughs.

The licensee stated that these would be cleaned out by Dec. 12, 2003. Bi-weekly cleaning of the receptacles will be done to prevent the non-compliance from recurring.

Note: New shelter built at the south end of the large hoofstock area measures 38 feet X 30 feet. There are 71 Fallow deer (60

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adults and 11 fawns). The structure itself does not have sides, thus no windbreaks. Discussed with licensee the addition of siding on the west side of the shelter to protect animals from inclement weather from the west. The south and east sides have protection in the way of nearby shrubbery, fencing, and trees. To observe over time to see if size of shelter is suitable for the number of animals. Licensee stated that some of the Fallow deer will be sold.

Discussed necessity of having a written diet plan for the large felids that is approved by the attending veterinarian in consultation with a qualified veterinary nutritionist. This was discussed with the licensee, Lloyd Beebe, on Sept. 2, 1999, by the previous USDA veterinary inspector, as documented on the inspection report for Aug. 31, 1999. A copy of Animal Care Policy #25 was included with that report.

Also, the attending veterinarian must approve a feeding program where the animals are not being fed at least once a day. The canids are only being fed every other day.

Copy of Animal Care Policy #25, Proper Diet for Large Felids, given to licensee [redacted] on Dec. 15, 2003.
