

***(a) The food shall be wholesome, palatable, and free from contamination and of sufficient quantity and nutritive value to maintain all animals in good health. The diet shall be prepared with consideration for the age, species, condition, size, and type of the animal. ***



Felid diet as previously written and approved by attending veterinarian is not the same as diet curenly being fed. Written diet indicates 50% chicken parts, but current diet has a higher percentage of those parts. In order for the inspector to ensure that the diet is of sufficient nutritive value for the animals being fed, it must be in writing and approved by the attending veterinarian, or a recognized nutritional expert. Diet as available for review during inspection was approved by the previous attending veterinarian. The current attending veterinarian must approve the diet, and then the diet must be fed as approved, to ensure diet is nutritionally adequate. A new written diet was presented during inspection, but needs to be approved by the attending veterinarian.
