2.33 (b)

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

Section 2.33(b) Veterinary care: Each research facility shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include:

- (1) The availability of appropriate facilities, personnel, equipment, and services to comply with the provisions of this subchapter;
- (2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries.

This facility still has five dogs: 6959, 7608, 7994, 8292, and 8452 that received the facility's worst dental score in 2001 that have not yet had their teeth cleaned. These dogs all have their premolars and molars covered with tartar. Excessive dental tartar can result in infections in the mouth and the bacteria can also cause systemic health problems such as in the heart and kidneys. Dental care must be administered in a timely manner to prevent animal health problems. These five dogs need to have their teeth cleaned.

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Section 3.1(c)(2) Maintenance and replacement of surfaces: All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis.

The floor coating in building 2 is peeling up away from the concrete in the center aisle and along the walls. The concrete was sealed before the floor coating was applied, but the floor can not be adequately cleaned when urine, excreta and dirty water is between the peeling floor coating and the concrete. The peeling floor coating needs to be removed so that the floor of the animal room can be properly cleaned.
