No re-capping should be permitted • APHIS personnel are to report all needle sticks or unprotected exposures of biological materials to the Incident Safety Officer. • The sampler should position themselves when drawing the sample so as to minimize the opportunity for the animal being sampled to bite, kick, fall on or otherwise be harm the sampler.
