

Supplemental Note for Alternative Treatment Procedures for Noncompliant Dunnage in Maritime Cargo

- 1. If live quarantine pests are found in dunnage, the PPQ identifier will determine mitigation measures (i.e., fumigation, incineration, and re-exportation) that satisfy phytosanitary safeguarding on a case-by-case basis. The identifier will communicate mitigation recommendations to CBP.
- 2. Dunnage with timber pests with high risk of emergence of dispersal may require fumigation prior to transport for incineration. This treatment serves as a safeguarding measure and does not certify as treated for re-use.
- 3. Per Plant Protection Act; Title 7; Chapter 104; Section 7714(b), the importer(s) of record or the port authority will be responsible for the dunnage, if there is no nexus to the importer.
- 4. Per Plant Protection Act; Title 7; Chapter 104; Section 7714(b), the shipping line for the last ship docked at that pier will be responsible for dunnage abandoned pier side.
