



# Appendix A

## *A Guide to Entry Status of Animal Products in Passenger Baggage or the Mail*

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### Introduction

This appendix is a quick guide to regulating animal product importations in passenger baggage or the mail. If a country is **not** listed, consider it affected with all diseases.

The directions for regulating animal product importations are detailed in the Procedures section. The Reference section describes entry requirements in detail. Use the Reference section for commercial importations. **Never** use **Appendix A** for commercial importations.

#### Meats

Use **Table A-1-1** for importations of meat:

- 1 The strongest confirmation is documentation (labeling, commercial receipts and your own expertise). Do not necessarily take an individual's word for origin or animal class.
- 2 Must be cooked in the container and be commercially packaged and labeled. Must be in unopened containers or packages. Prohibit if ruminant meat from a country where BSE is known to occur.

Cooked, shelf stable meats and meat products that have been commercially packaged and labeled and that are in unopened packages, are enterable from anywhere. The following meats and meat products are enterable when they have been commercially packaged and labeled, contained in unopened packages, and originated in a country **free from diseases of concern** even though those meats may have been in an affected country:

- ◆ Cured and dried meats and meat products from ruminants
- ◆ Cooked, shelf stable meats and meat products

## Irish Pork or Poultry

### 1. That purchased at Dublin and Shannon Airports



All ruminant meat is prohibited because of BSE

You may permit the entry of pork and poultry from the Republic of Ireland when accompanied by the following two documents and certification:

- ◆ A copy of the Republic of Ireland Meat and Meat Products for Export to the USA Certificate. The copy of the certificate must show the establishment name and number and the official Irish Health Certificate number
- ◆ Certification that the meat meets the requirements of 9CFR 94.11 AND 9CFR 94.13
- ◆ A cash register receipt either attached to or part of the copy of the certificate identified in the bulleted item above. The cash register receipt must show that the meat originated in a duty-free Shop either in Dublin or Shannon Airport. The receipt must show the date, weight (amount), types, number of packages, and price of the meat;

Or, you may permit the entry of pork and poultry from the Republic of Ireland when accompanied by the following document and certification:

- ◆ An original Republic of Ireland Meat and Meat Products for Export to the USA Certificate showing that the meat originated in the Republic of Ireland. The certificate must be signed by a salaried veterinarian.
- ◆ Certification that the meat meets the requirements of 9CFR 94.11 AND 9CFR 94.13

## 2. Pork or Poultry from Northern Ireland



All ruminant meat is prohibited because of BSE

You may permit the entry of pork and poultry from Northern Ireland (part of the United Kingdom) when accompanied by the following document and certification:

An Official Meat Inspection Certificate from the United Kingdom or European Union showing that the meat originated in Northern Ireland. The certificate must be signed by a salaried veterinarian.

Certification that the meat meets the requirements of 9CFR 94.11 AND 9CFR 94.13

### Dry Soup Mixes

Use Table A-1-2 for importations of dry soup mixes arriving in passenger baggage or the mail. Dry soup mixes are dehydrated soup mixes containing meat. Some mixes contain rice or pasta, or some are just a powder mixture. All mixes must be commercially prepared. Directions for preparing the soup must only be the adding of hot water or adding water followed by a microwave treatment. For example, the directions may say to empty the contents of one envelope into a mug or large cup, add boiling water, etc. The directions must not include cooking. The meat may be in a powder form or in dried pieces the size of bouillon cubes or silver dollars. Ingredients may all be in one package or envelope, or may be in a bowl or cup with some of the ingredients in separate envelopes within the bowl or cup. A reasonable amount of soup mixes for personal consumption while traveling is to deter individuals from importing commercial quantities for resale. Be aware that it would be reasonable for a family of two coming into the United States for several weeks to have a case of 50 soup mixes for their daily consumption.

## Definitions of Abbreviations, Regions, and Matrix Headings

### Africa

Includes Algeria, Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo (Democratic Republic of), Congo (Republic of), Côte d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Morocco, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Republic of South Africa, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Swaziland, Tanzania, Togo, Tunisia, Uganda, Western Sahara, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

### ASF

African swine fever.

### Asia

Includes Afghanistan, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia (Kampuchea), China, Cyprus, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Laos (People's Democratic Republic), Lebanon, Macau, Malaysia, Maldives, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Syrian Arab Republic, Taiwan (Province of China), Thailand, United Arab Emirates, Vietnam, and Yemen. Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Estonia, Georgia, Japan,

Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Oman, Philippines, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkey, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan are listed separately.

## **BSE**

Bovine spongiform encephalopathy

## **Central America**

Includes Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama; excludes Costa Rica.

## **Cooked, Shelf Stable Meats**

A condition that applies high temperature that renders the meat or meat product shelf stable. The process used is lock stepped:

1. Pack the meat in containers,
2. Completely seal the containers against the escape or entry of air (hermetically sealed); then
3. Cook the meat.

The temperature must be high enough to produce a sterile product (one that is free from bacteria or other microorganisms). Unless appropriately certified, such meat from countries affected with a disease of concern must be in rigid metal or plastic containers and must meet the shelf-stable requirements published in this manual.

## **Cured and Dried**

Unless appropriately certified, to be enterable, cured and dried meat of ruminants (and ruminant meat only) must remain firm (not give way) when compressed. Contrast bologna (gives way when compressed) with hard salami (remains rigid).

## **END**

Exotic Newcastle Disease (formerly VVND).

## **Eggs**

If the importation is cooked or boiled eggs, crack a random sample to verify that there are no viable embryos, or puncture the contents to ensure that there are no viable embryos.

## **Evaporated Milk**

A condition which applies heat resulting in the milk being shelf stable without refrigeration. The milk is concentrated in a liquid form, poured into containers, completely sealed in containers against the escape or entry of air (hermetically sealed), and then processed by heat using a commercial method.

## **FMD**

Foot-and-mouth disease

## **FMD/SR**

Foot-and-mouth disease free with special requirements to apply

## **HC**

Hog cholera

## **Milk**

All milk products from FMD affected countries are prohibited. The exception is a product intended for infants or very young children accompanying passengers are enterable if in a reasonable or small amount for several days' use. For milk, there are exceptions to restricting entry to milk. That is, products containing powdered or dry milk that are obviously for human use are enterable. For example, soup mixes, drink mixes, baking mixes, baby formula mixes, and similar products that are prepackaged and labeled in individual serving packages, normal retail size packages, or packaged for distribution in institutional sizes. Milk products intended for infants or very young children accompanying passengers are enterable if in a reasonable or small amount for several days' use.



Because of BSE in Ireland, all ruminant meat is prohibited—even cooked, shelf stable.

## **SE**

*Salmonella enteritidis*

## **South America**

Includes Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Falkland Islands, Guyana, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, and Venezuela. Argentina, Brazil, Chile, French Guiana, and Uruguay are listed separately.

## **SVD**

Swine vesicular disease

## **SVD/SR**

Swine vesicular disease free with special requirements to apply

## **United Kingdom**

England, Scotland, Wales, and Isle of Man, Northern Ireland is listed separately.

## Legend For Matrix

### **C**

An official meat inspection certificate is required. Certification must be present that describes how the product was processed. Go to the Reference section.

### **CS**

An official meat inspection certificate is required with two sets of statements. The first set of statements must describe how the product was processed for hog cholera (9CFR 94.9(b)(1)(iii)). The second set of statements must affirm that the product meets the special requirements for SVD (9CFR 94.13).

### **E**

The importation is enterable with adequate proof of origin.

### **P**

Prohibit the entry of the importation.

### **RE**

Restrict the entry of the importation. Go to the Reference section unless the product is milk.

### **SR**

1. Because the country supplements its meat supply from sources affected with FMD or SVD, special requirements apply.
2. Go to the Reference section covering meats and meat products.
3. These special requirements (9CFR 94.11 or 94.13) only apply to meat imports. they do not apply to importations of inedible meat by-products or other animal products and by-products.

### **X**

Disease status is known to be present in the region or country.
