IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF MALAYSIA FOR BREEDING SWINE EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The swine must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and endorsed by a Veterinary Services (VS) veterinarian. The certificate must provide the names and addresses of the consignor and consignee, the total number of animals in the shipment, the import permit number, the means of transportation, and complete identification of the animals. In addition, the certificate must include the following certification statements and the dates of the indicated testing.

CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS

1. The United States has been free of African swine fever, Classical swine fever (hog cholera), and foot-and-mouth disease for the 12 months prior to export.
2. The premises of origin have been free of Aujeszky's disease (pseudorabies), brucellosis, leptospirosis, porcine enteroviral encephalomyelitis, porcine dermatitis and nephropathy syndrome (PDNS), porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS), postweaning multisystemic wasting syndrome (PMWS), swine vesicular disease, and transmissible gastroenteritis (TGE) for the 6 months prior to export.
3. The swine were examined by me within 30 days prior to export and found healthy and free of evidence of infectious disease.

TEST REQUIREMENTS

The swine must be tested as prescribed below, with negative results, within 6 months prior to export. All tests must be performed at a laboratory acceptable to USDA.

1. Brucellosis: Buffered *Brucella* antigen test (specifically, the card test) OR tube agglutination test at a 1:50 dilution
2. PRRS: Immunoperoxidase monolayer assay (IPMA) OR indirect fluorescent antibody (IFA) test at a 1:20 dilution OR ELISA

EMBARKATION CERTIFICATION

At the port of embarkation, a VS port veterinarian must attach to the U.S. Origin Health Certificate a completed VS Form 17-37, Certificate of Inspection of Export Animals, showing:

1. The name and address of the consignor.
2. The name and address of the consignee.

3. The number and species of animals to be shipped.
4. A statement that the animals have been given a careful veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation and found free of evidence of communicable disease and exposure thereto within 24 hours of exportation.
