IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF BARBADOS FOR  
PIGEONS FROM THE UNITED STATES

- A. The flock(s) of origin was carefully examined and no evidence of exposure to the following diseases was found:
1. Newcastle disease, infectious coryza, infectious laryngotracheitis, fowl cholera, fowl plague, typhoid pullorum disease, ornithosis, mycoplasma synoviae, mycoplasma gallisepticum, avian encephalomyelitis, egg drop syndrome virus and paramyxovirus.
  2. The birds for export are free from signs of contagious and infectious disease.
  3. No outbreak of pigeon paramyxovirus, Newcastle disease and Avian influenza has occurred within fifty (50) kilometers of the flock of origin in the past six (6) months.
  4. The birds have been vaccinated with killed Newcastle Disease vaccine within thirty (30) days of exportation.
- B. Leg Band numbers must be recorded on the export certificate.
- C. The birds will be examined on arrival in the country by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture, Telephone No. (Area Code 427-5073 or 427-5492).
- D. The birds must be held in quarantine for a minimum period of thirty (30) days on premises approved by the Senior Veterinary Officer.

NOTE:

An import permit must be obtained prior to exportation of pigeons from the Ministry of Agriculture, Veterinary Services, The Pine, St. Michael, Barbados, Telephone No. (Area Code 809-427-5073 or 809-427-5492).
