

USDA, Wildlife Services: Rabies Research in Burlington, VT

Biologists will be live trapping raccoons and skunks in the Greater Burlington area during summer and fall of 2016 to monitor the success of oral rabies vaccines used to limit the spread of rabies in wildlife. Biological samples will be collected from each captured animal, which then will be released. Some animals will also be radio-collared and tracked using telemetry to better understand urban wildlife ecology.
