



What is the Foreign Animal Disease Preparedness and Response Plan (FAD PReP)?




The FAD PReP integrates and synchronizes the principles of the National Response Framework, the National Incident Management System, and the National Animal Health Emergency Management System.

Principles of FAD PReP

- Provide a unified State-Federal-Tribal-industry planning process that respects local knowledge and responds with speed and certainty.
- Ensure the unified command sets clearly defined and obtainable goals.
- Employ science-based and risk-management approaches that protect public health and animal health, stabilize animal agriculture, the food supply, and the economy.
- Ensure guidelines, strategies, and procedures are communicated and understood by responders and stakeholders.

What is the FAD PReP Mission?

- Define stakeholder expectations for successful and timely outcomes.
- Provide a systems approach to preparedness issues that need additional time, attention, and collaboration.
- Identify and resolves issues that may become competing interests during an outbreak.
- Identify resources and personnel for FAD outbreaks.
- Rapidly incorporate complex veterinary functions and countermeasures into emergency operations.

- Provides a single source for critical FAD planning, response, and analytical documents.
- Provides emergency management information and animal disease information for planners and responders.
