Livestock Included in the Rule

- Captive cervids ← Part 77
- Cattle and bison
- Equines
- Poultry ← References NPIP
- Sheep and goats ← Part 79
- Swine ← Part 71.19 (85 if applicable)

Official ID

- Defined by species
- States/Tribes must accept all methods of official ID
- Receiving State can't require specific method of ID
- Shipping/receiving States/Tribes may accept other ID methods if both agree

ICVI Defined in Part 86

Interstate certificate of veterinary inspection (ICVI). An official document issued by a Federal, State, Tribal, or accredited veterinarian certifying the inspection of animals in preparation for interstate movement.

(Also list other criteria of an ICVI)



Poultry

- **Official identification methods**

- Sealed and numbered leg bands in the manner referenced in the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) regulations (9 CFR parts 145 through 147).
- Group/lot identification when a group/lot identification number (GIN) may be used.

Poultry

Official identification required, unless:

- Shipment is from a hatchery to a redistributor or poultry grower or from a redistributor to a poultry grower
 - Person responsible for receiving the chick maintains a record of the supplier of the chicks
- Poultry are identified as agreed upon by the States or Tribes involved in the movement

Poultry

Movement documentation:

- ICVI required, unless:
 - They are from a flock participating in the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) and;
 - accompanied by the documentation required under the NPIP regulations (9 CFR parts 145 through 147) for participation in that program.

Final Rule: Poultry

Movement documentation:

- ICVI required, unless:
 - Moved from the farm of origin for veterinary medical examination, treatment, or diagnostic purposes and either returned to the farm of origin without change in ownership or euthanized and disposed of at the veterinary facility.

Final Rule: Poultry

Movement documentation:

- ICVI required, unless:
 - Moved directly from one State through another State and back to the original State.
 - Moved between shipping and receiving States or Tribes with a VS Form 9-3



Final Rule: Poultry

Movement documentation:

- ICVI required, unless:
 - Documentation other than an ICVI is used as agreed upon by animal health officials in the shipping and receiving States or Tribes.
 - Moved under permit in accordance with 9 CFR part 82.
