USDA APHIS WS is awarding \$2.535 million through Cooperative Agreements to twenty State Departments of wildlife in sixteen states, and one Tribal organization representing twenty Federally recognized Native American Tribal governments. These projects will allow recipients to further develop and implement CWD management, response, and research activities in wild cervids, including surveillance and testing.
