3. Explain the procedure producing pain and/or distress

- 1) Male Dwarf rabbits (0.6-1.0 kg) or New Zealand White rabbits (2-3 kg) are anesthetized with inhale isoflurane (4% for induction and 1.5% for maintenance).
- 2) The right thigh is shaved and prepared for aseptic surgery. An incision is made in the thigh, exposing muscle which is reflected back to expose the right sciatic nerve. A sterile ameroid constrictor ring (size to be determined) is then slipped around the sciatic nerve, and turned 45 degrees to hold it in place. Once in place, muscle is repositioned, and the wound is closed in layers, using sutures and wound clips.

The ameroid constrictors come sterilized in a variety of sizes and are shaped like doughnuts with a stainless steel casing. A slit allows the constrictor to slip around the nerve. Since the sciatic nerve is shaped more like a band than a cord, a forty-five degree turn of the constrictor prevents it from slipping out. In the animal, the ameroid will absorb body liquid and begin to expand. The stainless steel casing prevents the outer diameter from increasing, causing the slit to close within 12 hours and gradually constricting the sciatic nerve.

- 3) Pain threshold measurement: several days (to be determined) after placement of ameroid constrictors.
 - a. Mechanical allodynia will be quantified using the von Frey Test. Mechanical stimulation is produced by automated von Frey filaments (IITC Instruments), which are calibrated to apply a constant bending force on the site applied. The filaments are applied to the paw for a duration of approximately 1-3 sec with an interstimulus interval of approximately 5-10 seconds.
 - b. Heat hyperalgesia will be quantified by measuring paw withdrawal latency (PWL) response to radiant heat applied to the plantar surface of the hindpaw. The heat stimulus is produced by a 50-watt halogen light bulb enclosed in a custom-built case, which allows focusing of the light source onto the paw (IITC Instruments). PWL was recorded to the nearest 0.01 second, and a 20-second cutoff will be imposed on the stimulus duration to prevent tissue damage.
 - c. The Basile-Analgesy-meter (Stoelting, IL) will be used to assess mechanical sensitivity to pressure in both the nerve-injured and control paws. The analgesy-meter has a dome-tipped plinth (0.7 mm, with a curvature of 36°) that exerts a force to the dorsum of the rabbit's hind paw that increases at a constant rate. The pain threshold is defined as the force in grams at which the rabbits withdraws its paw.
- 4) Drug treatment: rabbits receive subcutaneous injections of control article (saline, 2 ml/kg) and test articles (10 mg/kg ELN-104572 and 200 mg/kg gabapentin or 3 mg/kg morphine). Mechanical allodynia and heat hyperalgesia are tested prior, 0.5, 1, 2, and 4 hrs after drug administrations.

4. Provide scientific justification....

Elan Pharmaceuticals has Therapeutic Pain Program aimed to find analgesic agents against neuropathic pain and inflammatory pain. We have identified a compound that could be a potent pain therapeutic. This compound is effective in blockade of bradykinin-induced hypotension in rabbits. However, this compound is not effective in the rat pain models. The species difference of this compound on animal models is probably due to the fact that the compound blocks receptors expressed in human and rabbit, **but not rat** cell lines *in vitro*. Therefore, we need to set up a rabbit model of neuropathic pain to further test this compound and its analogs.

Since pain is a complex perceptual experience that can be quantified only indirectly in animals, behavioral measures or nociceptive reflexes in intact animals must be evaluated.

This is an analgesic drug study therefore the use of drugs to relieve pain would interfere with the test or compromise interpretation of the resulting data.

1)Project Title: Development and Testing of New Tuberculosis Vaccines, 95-130-1 Species: Guinea Pigs Animals Used: 620 Description: The primary objective of this study is to develop new and better vaccines against tuberculosis in humans and animals. 2)Project Title: Pathogenic Mechanisms of Leptospirosis, 01-148-2 Species: Guinea Pigs Animals Used: 72 Description: The overall goal of this study is to identify proteins of Leptospira interrogans that are expressed in vivo during infection.

1) Justification: Vaccine development requires in vivo protection experiments. There are no alternatives to an animal model for testing a vaccine against tuberculosis and there are no known correlates of protection against tuberculosis that would allow one to judge the efficacy of a vaccine without challenging an animal. Of the rodent models, the guinea pig model of pulmonary tuberculosis most closely resembles human disease clinically, pathologically, and immunologically. Guinea pigs infected with M. Tuberculosis develop disseminated disease that is manifested by anorexia and weight loss. Animals are weighed daily to monitor progression of the disease, and euthanized immediately if they become moribund. The only medication that could relieve any discomfort would be anti-tuberculosis antibiotics. Treating the animals with antibiotics would completely defeat the purpose of the experiment. 2) Justification: The infection model should resemble a natural infection as closely as possible, and is an essential consideration for a valid and meaningful experiment. It also requires that infection be allowed to proceed as in a naturally occurring case such that the organism will express relevant protective and diagnostic antigens throughout each stage of infection. For this reason, it is important to avoid administration of any substances, including sedatives, analgesics or anesthetics that will induce alternative protein expression and lead to irrelevant or misleading results.

3. **Explain the procedure producing pain and/or distress.**

We are studying treatments of genital herpes. Identification of an appropriate formulation for application to the genital region of humans will require the use of experimental animals. The guinea pig model is well recognized and is a long-standing means of studying herpes infection and for evaluating anti-viral activity of drugs. This model closely mimics human disease in the characteristics and location of lesions.

Female Hartley guinea pigs weighing approximately 300-350 grams will be inoculated intravaginally with HSV-2. The inoculation will be done by inserting into the vaginal tract, and rotating approximately 10 times a moistened calcium alginate tipped swab (to rupture the vaginal closure membrane) soaked in an appropriate virus concentration that would result in a 90-100% infection rate.

Topical treatment will be three times daily beginning at least 24 hours post inoculation and continuing for 10-11 days. Topical treatment will be accomplished by using a treated cotton swab both intravaginally and topically to the perineal skin of the guinea pig. Virus induced lesions on the external skin will be scored daily. Lesions may become large ulcers and may macerate.

Additionally, to determine the effect of treatment on virus replication, swabs of vaginal secretions will be obtained on specified days following viral inoculation.

4. **Provide scientific justification why pain and/or distress could not be relieved. State methods or means used to determine that pain and/or distress relief would interfere with test results.**

Isoflurane anesthetic will be used prior to viral inoculation and treatments to minimize pain and distress during intra-vaginal procedures. However, the symptoms of the disease (i.e. vesicles which become ulcers which may macerate) cannot be treated with analgesics or other pain relieving treatments because they may interfere with the efficacy or toxicity of compounds being tested.

In addition, anti-inflammatory drugs such as NSAIDs will affect the progression of the disease due to their effect on inflammation and the immune response. Other analgesics, such as morphine derivatives, also have an anti-inflammatory effect and affect the immune system. Local analgesics will affect the delivery of the topical drug and interfere with their penetration into the area or with their effect on the lesions.

Two weeks after sensitization, the animals are exposed to the allergen again to evoke an asthma response (this is referred to as the 'challenge'). If appropriate therapeutics are not present, this results in short term bronchoconstriction (swelling of the airways, similar to an acute anaphylactic asthma attack in man).

It is not possible to provide analgesics or anesthetics to the animals to alleviate the short term distress as these agents could 1) interfere with the uptake/distribution/mechanisms of action of the novel agents being tested and would therefore confound research data and 2) would alleviate or minimize the very reaction that ██████ is attempting to treat with novel compounds. Animals are continuously monitored throughout the procedure. Scientific literature searches have been performed to determine that this model is the most appropriate means of testing efficacy of anti-asthmatic compounds and that there are no viable alternatives to alleviate the short term respiratory distress experienced by some animals.

Explanation for Category E, APHIS Form 7023

Roche Bioscience animal research and testing protocols are designed, insofar as is possible, to eliminate pain and distress. In some cases, however, the use of anesthetics, analgesics, or tranquilizing drugs would impair or invalidate test results.

One primate (*Cynomologus*) may have experienced pain or distress when used to evaluate the toxic potential of a new drug as required by regulatory agencies (i.e., FDA). It was not the intent of the study to produce pain and pain-relieving drugs were not implemented due to interference they would cause with the study data. Veterinary attention was sought prior to deciding to euthanize the animal. For decades, the FDA has required the use of one rodent and one nonrodent species to prove drug safety. Dogs and nonhuman primates are the industry standards for nonrodent, mammalian species.

The following is an excerpt from the IACUC approved protocol that the animal was used under.

"If animals are debilitated or moribund, or are experiencing severe pain, a veterinarian will be notified or the animals will be euthanized. (as per IACUC Policy 1992-4: "Guidelines For Determining An Animal In A Moribund State")."

In this instance, a veterinarian euthanized the animal to eliminate pain or distress.

Pigs on this protocol were pro-actively placed in the "E" stress category because of a small risk (less than 5%) of late occlusion (after 24-hours post-surgery) of the treated artery, which *could* cause myocardial infarction (heart attack).

None of the pigs used for this project (four in number) experienced a myocardial infarction, but because the CSMC IACUC does not currently change pain and distress codes retroactively, they are entered into column "E" on the report.

HSV-I inoculation of rabbits' eyes: In a percentage (depending upon the strain of virus used) of the rabbits inoculated, ocular (eye) infection spreads to the brain and causes neurological symptoms such as seizures (encephalitis) between days 10 – 21.

Other clinical symptoms include conjunctivitis, iritis, stromal keratitis, and clouding. Symptoms include redness and swelling of the eye, and clouding of the cornea. These other symptoms are transient and not severe. In approximately 10% of the eyes inoculated, symptoms result in temporary loss of vision. Less than 5% of all animals may temporarily lose vision in both eyes. Rabbits severely affected in both eyes are euthanatized.

Transient conjunctivitis, stromal keratitis, and corneal clouding: These signs/symptoms are transient and occur at approximately 10 – 21 days post-inoculation (duration of approximately 11 days). According to human ophthalmologists, this course of infection is not severely painful in humans, because when the virus infects the eye, it penetrates the nerve endings and deadens the sensory nerves of the cornea. It is assumed that a similar situation exists in the rabbits.

A member of the IACUC had experienced Herpes Ocular infection first-hand and informed the IACUC that although this person was distressed to have the infection, the pain was not severe.

The Attending Veterinarian informed the IACUC that although topical analgesia could be administered to the rabbits' eyes, the available agents would need to be

applied every two to four hours. The application of topical ocular analgesia would require frequent handling and restraint that would be stressful for the rabbits. The Principal Investigator informed the IACUC that topical ocular analgesics were rarely administered to, and were not necessary for, human patients with ocular HSV-I infection.

It was determined by the IACUC that topical ocular analgesic administration would likely distress the rabbits more than withholding the analgesic therapy due to the required frequency of restraint, and inherent stress associated with the instillation of compounds into the eyes.

In 40-60% of the rabbits inoculated with the specific strains of virus used in these experiments, the virus travels up the optic nerve and infects the brain causing encephalitis and accompanying seizure activity. Although the seizure itself probably is not distressful, severe seizures can result in traumatic injury.

All rabbits are monitored at least three times per day by the Comparative Medicine Clinical Staff and the Research Staff. Any rabbits found to be seizing, or otherwise exhibiting neurological signs, are anesthetized with SQ ketamine and euthanatized via IV administration of a commercially purchased veterinary euthanasia solution. Because these seizures have a rapid onset and cannot be predicted, preventative anesthesia, analgesia or anti-seizure medication cannot be administered in advance of the seizure.

We are studying the development of chronic pain using a laboratory model (experimental injury in the rat). To do this, an experimental injury of a sensory (hot, cold, touch, pain) nerve in the face is performed by placing a threadlike material around the nerve to cause inflammation. Pain behaviors (flinching, rubbing region with the forepaw, etc.) are measured after either touching the skin of the upper lip with a soft acrylic fiber or the injection of a small amount of an irritant that causes temporary inflammation. The purpose of this research is to determine what factors contribute to the development of exaggerated, persistent pain following nerve injury or inflammation. Such studies will eventually contribute to the improved clinical management of chronic pain conditions. Two procedures are potentially painful: 1. Following injury to the IoN, we expect the development of allodynia, and normally innocuous mechanical stimulation using a von Frey hair may produce a momentary discomfort. The pain and distress caused under these circumstances, however, should be brief and relatively mild. 2. The formalin test, on the other hand, is meant to test the animal's response to anoxious stimulus (chemical). The subcutaneous injection of dilute formalin (3%) is a standard model of acute orofacial pain. Generally there is a rapid 1-2 minute response, followed by a long (~10 min. quiet period). This quiet period is then followed by a second period of hyperalgesia and allodynia that lasts for about 20-30 minutes before completely subsiding. Thus, the pain and distress will be limited in duration and severity.

Partial injury to somatosensory nerves in rats results in functional and cytochemical alterations in sensory neurons, and in pain-associated behaviors that closely resemble human clinical neuropathic pain states. The long-term objectives of our research are to further clarify the peripheral and central mechanisms that contribute to the development and pathophysiology of neuropathic pain, and to characterize and evaluate the roles of nerve growth factor (NGF) in these processes. No post-operative analgesics will be used, because the drugs would interfere with the neuroinflammatory interactions that we are studying. Both the severity and regional and extraterritorial localization of the hyperalgesia/allodynia are parameters that we hope to estimate using behavioral testing. Previous studies have not reported self-mutilation or other behaviors that would suggest extreme distress, even in those animals that exhibit abnormal mechanical and thermal sensitivities in areas outside the territory of the IoN. Behavioral changes are expected, but only dramatic changes, such as seizures or extreme lethargy, would be considered serious enough to warrant an animal's removal from the study.

3. Explain the procedure producing pain and/or distress

- 1) Male Dwarf rabbits (0.6-1.0 kg) or New Zealand White rabbits (2-3 kg) are anesthetized with inhale isoflurane (4% for induction and 1.5% for maintenance).
- 2) The right thigh is shaved and prepared for aseptic surgery. An incision is made in the thigh, exposing muscle which is reflected back to expose the right sciatic nerve. A sterile ameroid constrictor ring (size to be determined) is then slipped around the sciatic nerve, and turned 45 degrees to hold it in place. Once in place, muscle is repositioned, and the wound is closed in layers, using sutures and wound clips.

The ameroid constrictors come sterilized in a variety of sizes and are shaped like doughnuts with a stainless steel casing. A slit allows the constrictor to slip around the nerve. Since the sciatic nerve is shaped more like a band than a cord, a forty-five degree turn of the constrictor prevents it from slipping out. In the animal, the ameroid will absorb body liquid and begin to expand. The stainless steel casing prevents the outer diameter from increasing, causing the slit to close within 12 hours and gradually constricting the sciatic nerve.

- 3) Pain threshold measurement: several days (to be determined) after placement of ameroid constrictors.
 - a. Mechanical allodynia will be quantified using the von Frey Test. Mechanical stimulation is produced by automated von Frey filaments (IITC Instruments), which are calibrated to apply a constant bending force on the site applied. The filaments are applied to the paw for a duration of approximately 1-3 sec with an interstimulus interval of approximately 5-10 seconds.
 - b. Heat hyperalgesia will be quantified by measuring paw withdrawal latency (PWL) response to radiant heat applied to the plantar surface of the hindpaw. The heat stimulus is produced by a 50-watt halogen light bulb enclosed in a custom-built case, which allows focusing of the light source onto the paw (IITC Instruments). PWL was recorded to the nearest 0.01 second, and a 20-second cutoff will be imposed on the stimulus duration to prevent tissue damage.
 - c. The Basile-Analgesy-meter (Stoelting, IL) will be used to assess mechanical sensitivity to pressure in both the nerve-injured and control paws. The analgesy-meter has a dome-tipped plinth (0.7 mm, with a curvature of 36°) that exerts a force to the dorsum of the rabbit's hind paw that increases at a constant rate. The pain threshold is defined as the force in grams at which the rabbits withdraws its paw.
- 4) Drug treatment: rabbits receive subcutaneous injections of control article (saline, 2 ml/kg) and test articles (10 mg/kg ELN-104572 and 200 mg/kg gabapentin or 3 mg/kg morphine). Mechanical allodynia and heat hyperalgesia are tested prior, 0.5, 1, 2, and 4 hrs after drug administrations.

Elan Pharmaceuticals has Therapeutic Pain Program aimed to find analgesic agents against neuropathic pain and inflammatory pain. We have identified a compound that could be a potent pain therapeutic. This compound is effective in blockade of bradykinin-induced hypotension in rabbits. However, this compound is not effective in the rat pain models. The species difference of this compound on animal models is probably due to the fact that the compound blocks receptors expressed in human and rabbit, **but not rat** cell lines *in vitro*. Therefore, we need to set up a rabbit model of neuropathic pain to further test this compound and its analogs.

Since pain is a complex perceptual experience that can be quantified only indirectly in animals, behavioral measures or nociceptive reflexes in intact animals must be evaluated.

This is an analgesic drug study therefore the use of drugs to relieve pain would interfere with the test or compromise interpretation of the resulting data.

The use of Freund's Complete Adjuvant (CFA) for the production of antibodies may cause results ranging from momentary or slight pain, to distress such as decrease appetite/activity level, open sores/necrotic skin lesions, abscesses. USDA Exceptions to provisions of the Act:

With respect to the general prohibition of multiple survival surgery, the Administrator of USDA has granted an exception in which cesarean sections are sometimes performed in normal female primates during successive pregnancies. This exception applied to 40 animals during the reporting period.

Justification for cesarean sections

Studies of birth defects, fetal disease, and growth retardation require that pregnancies be terminated by cesarean section at a standardized time point to allow for careful examination of fetuses for defective development and fetal weight. Allowing these pregnancies to proceed to full term has several pitfalls, including possible loss of the infant (and experimental data) due to maternal cannibalization if it is born dead, prematurely, or with a serious defect. In addition, the large range in gestational age at normal delivery would make it difficult to accurately assess birth weight, an important indicator of normality in these studies. Taking the infant by cesarean section gives us the highest chance of obtaining a viable infant.

Justification for multiple cesarean sections in the same animal

Multiple cesarean sections are routinely performed in human females. Animals undergoing hysterotomies at the CRPRC rarely have post surgical complications and are fertile post-operatively. Any animal with complications is dropped from the protocol. Post operative animals do not demonstrate any handicaps or ill health following the cesarean.

Our practice has been to maintain a breeding colony which provides the required pregnancies for these studies. Multiple use of animals allows us to use purpose bred animals from our colony rather than capturing wild primates. One can see that if we use a given number of animals per year, and if these animals could never be used again, it would be necessary to import additional animals rather than use our existing breeding colony. Also, without multiple use, animals having already had a cesarean section, (many of our animals have), could not be utilized in the breeding colony.

The net effect of using these animals only once would be that an increased number of primates would be used, and that possibly a number of animals might be euthanized that could otherwise remain in our breeding colony for many years. This exception allows us to continue our studies while minimizing the number of animals used, minimizing our use of threatened species from the wild, and prolonging the useful lives of our breeding animals.

IACUC Approved Exceptions to provisions of the Act:

In eight studies involving 17 animals, the IACUC has granted exceptions to allow primates to be maintained on regiments of restricted water intake. These are studies in which the animal receives water or other liquids as a reward for performing tasks. If the animals were allowed to satiate themselves with water outside of the study period, they would not be motivated to perform the tasks. The animals receive their water during the day as they perform the tasks.

The IACUC and the Primate Center have developed detailed guidelines to insure that these animals receive adequate amounts of water during the day to support their health and well-being. The animals are allotted carefully calculated fixed water rations based on their physiologic needs. Neither weight loss nor dehydration results. The animals are monitored very closely by veterinary staff and animal care staff; however, they are not routinely given two hours free choice access to water twice daily as would otherwise be required in the regulations.

1) Justification: Vaccine development requires in vivo protection experiments. There are no alternatives to an animal model for testing a vaccine against tuberculosis and there are no known correlates of protection against tuberculosis that would allow one to judge the efficacy of a vaccine without challenging an animal. Of the rodent models, the guinea pig model of pulmonary tuberculosis most closely resembles human disease clinically, pathologically, and immunologically. Guinea pigs infected with M. Tuberculosis develop disseminated disease that is manifested by anorexia and weight loss. Animals are weighed daily to monitor progression of the disease, and euthanized immediately if they become moribund. The only medication that could relieve any discomfort would be anti-tuberculosis antibiotics. Treating the animals with antibiotics would completely defeat the purpose of the experiment. 2) Justification: The infection model should resemble a natural infection as closely as possible, and is an essential consideration for a valid and meaningful experiment. It also requires that infection be allowed to proceed as in a naturally occurring case such that the organism will express relevant protective and diagnostic antigens throughout each stage of infection. For this reason, it is important to avoid administration of any substances, including sedatives, analgesics or anesthetics that will induce alternative protein expression and lead to irrelevant or misleading results.

The experimental infection that is produced with *Staphylococcus aureus* in this animal model may cause distress to a small proportion of the animals. Signs of infection appear at 18-24h after inoculation. Untreated, control rabbits are euthanized approximately 24h after inoculation, which minimizes the distress in these animals. Signs of infection abate with institution of antimicrobial agents in treated animals and generally resolve in two to three days. During the first two days of the experiment, supplemental fluid is administered to provide fluid replacement and some calories until the appetite returns. If fluid intake remains poor thereafter, fluid supplements are continued as needed. Food supplements such as carrots, lettuce, and greens are provided to encourage food intake and to help maintain normal flora.

Analgesics are not being used during the period of infection for the following reasons. 1) They are not necessary. Pain is not a prominent symptom of endocarditis. The chapter in Mandel's "Principles and Practice of Infectious Diseases" lists pain in association with endocarditis that occurs at various locations at a frequency of 10-15%. Pain is a more prominent feature of tricuspid valve (or right-sided) endocarditis, but the model is aortic valve endocarditis. Based on my experience with several hundred cases of endocarditis in humans, analgesics are rarely needed in the management of left-sided endocarditis. Also the protocol includes use of fluid supplementation and antimicrobial therapy, which ameliorate signs of the disease. 2) Analgesics also may alter the natural course of the disease, lead to over-sedation or respiratory depression, and thereby contribute to mortality, or have unanticipated interactions with antimicrobials. Administration of agents other than antimicrobials in a model of this type would be highly questionable scientifically and analgesic agents are not employed by any investigators using this model of infection.

"Monkeys are behaviorally trained using operant conditioning methods, working for liquid rewards or for nutritionally-complete 200 mg food pellet rewards. In training procedures in which liquid rewards are used, animals are deprived of all liquids for a period lasting from the end of one training session and a short, following ad libitum drinking period to the beginning of the next training session, typically about 22 hours. Animal weight is monitored daily; if his/her weight were to fall below 90% (which has not been recorded in training in these monkeys), all deprivation procedures would be halted. The liquid rewards used are typically Tan or fruit juices that have been enriched with vitamin C, for which these animals have a strong dietary need and a strong taste preference. The same basic procedures are applied when food pellet rewards are used in training. That is, animals are weight daily, and while their weights are within 90% of the pre-training weight, deprived for about 22 hours prior to the behavioral training session. After training is completed, they are fed standard monkey chow and fruit for a limited period (about 1 hours) ad libitum.

Animals work in behavioral training for between about 15 minutes up to no more than 2 hours. All participation is self-initiated (voluntary) by the monkey. With rare exception, monkeys work behavioral five days a week, and are given ad libitum access to fluids and food in their cage over the weekend. In a fluid-deprived monkey, animals have continuous, ad libitum access to food; in a food-deprived monkey, the animal has continuous, ad libitum access to fluids."

"Fluid restriction. The goal of our research is to understand the operation of the working brain. One accepted way to do this is to record the behavior of animals and the activity of single neurons during behavior. This is accomplished in our laboratory (and many others around the world) by training animals to fixate and track a small spot of light in exchange for fluid reinforcements. Excellent behavior performance and long enough sessions to acquire meaningful data require strong motivation on the part of the monkey, and the motivation is attained through fluid restriction. Our goal is to provide the animals with enough fluids so that they remain healthy and gain weight, without abolishing their motivation to work in our experiments. Animals are examined by a veterinarian before they are ever placed on fluid restriction. Body weight, behavior, appetite and stool quality are monitored frequently, and veterinarians called to assess individual animals as needed. Fluid intake is recorded daily, reviewed for each animal weekly by the Principal Investigator (or designate) to determine the following week's fluid schedule, and reported quarterly to the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee."

"Marmosets will be housed in intact family groups with older offspring helping to rear newborns. This is the preferred family structure of these animals. To accommodate this, up to nine animals will be housed in a 69 inch tall cage that provides 27.3 cubic feet. The floor area of these cages do not meet the AWR standard of 1.6 square feet per animal for animals up to 1 kg (adult *C. jacchus* are slightly over 400 gm), but exceed the 2.7 cubic feet of space that the regulations imply. These cages meet the performance criteria of the Animal Welfare Regulations in providing sufficient volume of space for these arboreal animals and the opportunity to express species-typical climbing and social behavior."

We are studying treatments of genital herpes. Identification of an appropriate formulation for application to the genital region of humans will require the use of experimental animals. The guinea pig model is well recognized and is a long-standing means of studying herpes infection and for evaluating anti-viral activity of drugs. This model closely mimics human disease in the characteristics and location of lesions.

Female Hartley guinea pigs weighing approximately 300-350 grams will be inoculated intravaginally with HSV-2. The inoculation will be done by inserting into the vaginal tract, and rotating approximately 10 times a moistened calcium alginate tipped swab (to rupture the vaginal closure membrane) soaked in an appropriate virus concentration that would result in a 90-100% infection rate.

Topical treatment will be three times daily beginning at least 24 hours post inoculation and continuing for 10-11 days. Topical treatment will be accomplished by using a treated cotton swab both intravaginally and topically to the perineal skin of the guinea pig. Virus induced lesions on the external skin will be scored daily. Lesions may become large ulcers and may macerate.

Additionally, to determine the effect of treatment on virus replication, swabs of vaginal secretions will be obtained on specified days following viral inoculation.

4. **Provide scientific justification why pain and/or distress could not be relieved. State methods or means used to determine that pain and/or distress relief would interfere with test results.**

Isoflurane anesthetic will be used prior to viral inoculation and treatments to minimize pain and distress during intra-vaginal procedures. However, the symptoms of the disease (i.e. vesicles which become ulcers which may macerate) cannot be treated with analgesics or other pain relieving treatments because they may interfere with the efficacy or toxicity of compounds being tested.

In addition, anti-inflammatory drugs such as NSAIDs will affect the progression of the disease due to their effect on inflammation and the immune response. Other analgesics, such as morphine derivatives, also have an anti-inflammatory effect and affect the immune system. Local analgesics will affect the delivery of the topical drug and interfere with their penetration into the area or with their effect on the lesions.

Rigel is testing the efficacy of novel compounds against an animal model of allergic asthma. Guinea pigs are sensitized, or made allergic to, an allergen. Two weeks after sensitization, the animals are exposed to the allergen again to evoke an asthma response (this is referred to as the 'challenge'). If appropriate therapeutics are not present, this results in short term bronchoconstriction (swelling of the airways, similar to an acute anaphylactic asthma attack in man).

4. Provide scientific justification why pain and/or distress could not be relieved. State methods or means used to determine that pain and/or distress relief would interfere with test results.

The studies Rigel is conducting are aimed at accessing various treatments that will alleviate the clinical symptoms of asthma (i.e. bronchoconstriction), so it is necessary to create these short-term respiratory distress symptoms in order to assess novel agent efficacy. It is not possible to provide analgesics or anesthetics to the animals to alleviate the short term distress as these agents could 1) interfere with the uptake/distribution/mechanisms of action of the novel agents being tested and would therefore confound research data and 2) would alleviate or minimize the very reaction that Rigel is attempting to treat with novel compounds. Animals are continuously monitored throughout the procedure. Scientific literature searches have been performed to determine that this model is the most appropriate means of testing efficacy of anti-asthmatic compounds and that there are no viable alternatives to alleviate the short term respiratory distress experienced by some animals.

Reviews of the current literature of acceptable means of euthanization conducted by both the PI and IACUC determined that all chemical means of euthanization would adversely impact the physiologic processes being investigated. Guillotining by appropriately trained personnel was determined to be the least painful or distressing means of euthanization available to meet the requirements of the study.
