HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(1) General requirements. The surfaces of housing facilities -- including perches, shelves, swings, boxes, houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures or objects within the facility -- must be constructed in a manner and made of materials that allow them to be readily cleaned and sanitized, or removed or replaced when worn or soiled.

*** The feed receptacles for the Rhesus are rusty, and in need of repainted or changed, so it can be easily cleaned and sanitized.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

*** The Bison shelter has two vertical supports in the corners of the shelter that needs repair to assure the integrity of the building, and to make it safe for these big size animals to be enclosed in.

***The Syrian bear pool is rusty in the inside and in need to be painted or lined to provide a surface which can be adequately cleaned.

FACILITIES, OUTDOOR.

(c) Drainage. A suitable method shall be provided to rapidly eliminate excess water. The method of drainage shall comply with applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations relating to pollution control or the protection of the environment.

*** The African lion enclosure has stagnant water. A method to drain the rain water should be established to keep the water running, and to eliminate the chance for mosquitoes breeding.

***The Mountain Lion enclosure has stagnant water, and need to establish a route for the water to keep running to a drain, and to prevent the water from being stagnant in the enclosure.

SANITATION.

(a) Cleaning of enclosures. Excreta shall be removed from primary enclosures as often as necessary to prevent contamination of the animals contained therein and to minimize disease hazards and to reduce odors. When enclosures are cleaned by hosing or flushing, adequate measures shall be taken to protect the animals confined in such enclosures from being directly sprayed with the stream of water or wetted involuntarily.

*** The lion's enclosure has a dirty wall that need to be cleaned and sanitized to protect the animal from diseases.

(a) Cleaning of enclosures. Excreta shall be removed from primary enclosures as often as necessary to prevent contamination of the animals contained therein and to minimize disease hazards and to reduce odors. When enclosures are cleaned by hosing or flushing, adequate measures shall be taken to protect the animals confined in such enclosures from being directly sprayed with the stream of water or wetted involuntarily

The enclosure that has the three potbelly pigs has chicken droppings. The enclosure need to be cleaned, and the chicken should be separated from the pigs to prevent such contamination.

(c) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart.

***The Himalayan bear pool has greenish color water that should be cleaned soon to protect the animal from, and to supply clean water for the animal to bath in.
