SUBJECT: This letter is an addendum to the March 14, 2011 request by Wyoming Sugar Growers LLC (WSG) to be the responsible entity and enter into a H7-1 compliance agreement with APHIS/BRS..

We are providing additional information on for importation and movement of H7-1 seed and root crop:

H7-1 seed will be moved to individual growers for Wyoming Sugar Growers LLC (list and addresses attached) in two manners by authorized seed company dealers (who receive H7-1 seed directly to their locations from the seed company under their compliance agreement:

- 1) The following seed dealers will deliver H7-1 seed from their locations to each grower location.



- 2) Growers will pick up seed at the seed dealers location and transport H7-1 seed to their location.

- 3) This transportation of the H7-1 seed would occur along the following highways and roads in Wyoming to their final grower destination. [Redacted PII], [Redacted PII], [Redacted PII] Fremont County [Redacted PII] Washakie County [Redacted PII]
- 4) Total H7-1 seed requirements will be approximately 5,000 units and if replanting due to spring conditions is warranted, we will amend this Compliance Agreement to reflect this additional H7-1 seed requirement. H7-1 seed movement will commence upon receipt of this Compliance Agreement and conclude by June 1, 2011.

The H7-1 root crop will be delivered from the grower locations (list attached) using appropriate means and methods to assure safely transporting of the root crop to Wyoming Sugar (destination) at the receiving stations operated by Wyoming Sugar

There are six receiving stations. Three in Big Horn County Wyoming ([REDACTED]) two in Fremont County Wyoming ([REDACTED]) and one in Washakie County Wyoming ([REDACTED]). These receiving stations are root crop destinations from the grower (origin) and are utilized to stock pile the root crop for later transport to the factory for processing (release). The grower's movement of the root crop to the receiving stations will commence on or about October 1, 2011 and conclude by November 15, 2011.

These receiving stations become the origin of supply of H7-1 root crop for processing and are transported via contract motor carrier ([REDACTED]) to the WSG factory at 300 South 1st street in Worland, WY for processing. The transporting from receiving station to factory for processing will commence on or about October 1, 2011 and conclude on or about January 15, 2012.

This transportation would occur along the following highways in Wyoming to their final grower destination. Wyoming Highways ([REDACTED])
