The U.S. Department of Agriculture has evidence that on or about the date(s) listed below, you or your organization committed the following violation(s) of Federal Regulations:

**Date of Violation: August 25, 2012**

**15 U.S.C. § 1824(2) Unlawful Acts**

"The (A) showing or exhibiting, in any horse show or horse exhibition, of any horse which is sore, (B) entering for the purpose of showing or exhibiting in any horse show or horse exhibition, any horse which is sore, (C) selling, auctioning, or offering for sale, in any horse sale or auction, any horse which is sore, and (D) allowing any activity described in clause (A), (B), or (C) respecting a horse which is sore by the owner of such horse."

**Date of Violation: August 25, 2012**

**9 C.F.R. § 11.3 Scar Rule**

"The scar rule applies to all horses born on or after October 1, 1975. Horses subject to this rule that do not meet the...scar rule criteria shall be considered to be "sore" and are subject to all prohibitions of...the Act."

Bill Bean allowed the entry of, for the purpose of showing, a horse, "He's Slim Shady," in the 74th Annual Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration in Shelbyville, TN, which was found sore.

**Date of Violation: August 25, 2012**

**9 C.F.R. § 11.2(c) Prohibition concerning exhibitors – Substances**

"All substances are prohibited on the extremities above the hoof of any Tennessee Walking Horse or racking horse while being shown, exhibited, or offered for sale at any horse show, horse exhibition, or horse sale or auction, except lubricants such as glycerine, petrolatum, and mineral oil, or mixtures thereof..."

Bill Bean allowed the entry of, for the purpose of showing or exhibiting, the horse, "He's Slim Shady," at the 74th Annual Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration in Shelbyville, TN, which was found to be wearing a black foreign substance on the left pastern.

The Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) created federal regulations to ensure the welfare of animals and help prevent the spread of animal and plant pests and diseases. Since violations of the regulations can have serious and costly impacts that are detrimental to the public interest, APHIS is providing you with an Official Warning for the violation(s) described above. Any further violation of these federal regulations may result in the assessment of a civil penalty, criminal prosecution, or other sanctions.
