Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) enforces regulations to protect the health and care of animals, plants, and agricultural industry. Violations of these regulations jeopardize the animal and plant health systems that are vital to protect American agriculture.

Our investigation shows that you have violated the United States Code of Federal Regulations as described on the enclosed Stipulation. APHIS laws and regulations provide for administrative and criminal penalties to enforce these regulatory requirements.

The Secretary of Agriculture may, after providing notice and opportunity for a hearing, impose civil penalties or other sanctions. You may, however, waive your right to a hearing and settle this matter by paying \$4,875 by April 18, 2007 and signing the enclosed Stipulation.

Animal Care Inspector Elizabeth Serven conducted an inspection of Judith Briscoe's facility and found numerous violations as it pertained to the health and safety of all of the animals kept their at the Spotted Acres Farm. Judith Briscoe provided a statement and it is part of this case file.

Information: Judith Briscoe is the owner and operator of Spotted Acres Farms. She lives at 375 Water Elm Lane in Flora, Illinois. She was the owner of two bears One of the bears killed a man on her property. Both bears were shot to death by the local Sheriffs Department.

## Previous

History: Judith Briscoe has no violations in the IES tracking system.

## Violation

Events: On February 7, 2006 USDA/APHIS/Animal Care Inspector Elizabeth Serven responded to Judith Briscoe's Farm in Flora, Illinois for the purpose of conducting an inspection of her facility. Upon arrival Animal Care Inspector Serven cited Ms. Briscoe for USDA Non Compliance Incidents. This was initiated because of a bear escaping from its pen and killing a volunteer at Spotted Acres Farm. The facility did not have appropriate equipment or measures in place to deal with an escape situation subsequently the bears were inappropriately euthanized. Several other violations were observed at the farm that related to the safety and health of the other animals kept their.



Ms. Briscoe has been licensed with the USDA as a Class A Breeder since 1995. At that time she was running a petting zoo at her facility with an A license. Her petting zoo has been closed now for several years due to financial difficulties. She has had no previous problems with the USDA, or variances granted.

When I went to the licensee's house, I had read about the incident in the paper, and given the fact that she was an A licensee and had at least 2 bears, I assumed that the bears were a breeding pair. I asked Ms Briscoe what she had a license for, and she said that she sells dogs, mini ponies, potbelly pigs, camels, and other barnyard species at an auction in South Carolina. I asked her if her bears had been a breeding pair, and she replied that the two bears were both intact males. She stated that when she started her petting zoo, that she had asked her previous inspector (B)(6), (B)(7)c what a good animal would be as a draw for a petting zoo. He told her that a pair of black bears would be a big draw for the petting zoo. So Ms Briscoe then constructed a 18'x15' pen with 2 dens for these bears, and purchased 2 3-day old black bear cubs. She said that at the time (B)(6), (B)(7)c had told her that if she needed to calm the bears down that giving them some Benadryl would help.

I asked Ms Briscoe to tell me about (B)(6), (B)(7)c and his role at the farm. She said that he was a family friend that came by occasionally when she needed help on the farm. He was unpaid and did not have a set schedule for coming out to the farm, it was just as needed. I asked if he had any prior experience with handling dangerous animals, and she told me that he had raised dogs and horses on his own place. When he would come to help he would clean and feed the animals on the farm unsupervised, or sometimes with Ms Briscoe. Ms Briscoe had been facing some health problems

recently and did not have anyone hired on to help her on a regular basis so (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) would come over when she was having a bad health day to do the work for her. On February 1, 2006, (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) and Ms Briscoe did chores together. They fed both bears around noon, and bedded down their dens. According to Ms Briscoe this angered the bears, which had not been hibernating as normal due to the unseasonably warm temperatures. At a later time (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) left to go home, and Ms Briscoe went in town. When Ms Briscoe returned at approximately 4:45pm she noticed that "Buddy the bear" was loose inside the perimeter fence. She then tried to call her son, and when she got no answer called (B)(6), (B)(7)(c). (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) arrived 10 minutes later, and at that time they both opened the perimeter fence and proceeded inside to try and herd the bear back into its pen. (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) entered with a bag of dog food in hopes of enticing the bear back to its cage with it. When they both entered the perimeter, the bear charged at (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) knocking him down. At this point Ms Briscoe ran back to her truck, leaving the perimeter gates wide open. "Buddy" followed her back to the truck, and climbed onto the vehicle jumping up and down. When (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) was first knocked down he was not injured, and proceeded on to the bear's enclosure to lock "General Patton" into his den, and open the door to the enclosure so "Buddy" could go back in. He then walked back to the opening where the bear was still on the truck. When he approached the truck, "Buddy" then turned and attacked (B)(6), (B)(7)(c). At this point Ms Briscoe called 911 on her cell phone to get help. She yelled at the bear and tried to throw food at it to get it off of (B)(6), (B)(7)(c). The bear pinned Mr. (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) to the ground and began to maul him.

At approximately 5:15pm Deputy (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) with the Clay County Sheriff's Office arrived on the scene. He parked near the petting zoo and then rounded the corner to see the bear on top of (B)(6), (B)(7)(c). He ran back to his squad car to get his shotgun with which to shoot the bear. When he went to shoot the bear, (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) was still conscious and hitting the bear with his hands trying to get him off. The bear lifted its head, and had (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) intestines in his mouth, at which point Deputy Spitzner shot the bear with a 12 gauge deer slug in the head. The bear fell down with (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) intestines still in his mouth. They then rolled the bear off of (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) at which point the Deputy shot the bear a second time because his feet were still moving. The paramedics then came in and took Mr. (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) away to the hospital. They had to remove parts of his intestines from the bear's mouth prior to leaving in hopes that he could be saved. At this point Ms Briscoe left with the ambulance to go to the hospital. Before she left she told the Sheriff's department to shoot the other bear.

At this point Ms Briscoe's son (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) was on the scene as well. The police did not shoot the other bear, but Ms Briscoe's son did. At the time "General Patton" was shot, he was confined inside his enclosure, which was locked shut. (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) shot the bear twice to kill him with a shotgun. Inside of the pen there was a definite area where you could tell the first shot was taken at due to the large volume of blood. But in other areas of the cage there were patches of blood which suggests that the bear stumbled around for a while before either the second shot was taken or before he actually died. (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) removed "General Patton's" body from the enclosure, and is planning on donating it to a university. The body of "Buddy" was taken by a pathologist in a hearse to Evansville Indiana where it was tested for rabies.

After doing an inspection with Ms Briscoe I found multiple non compliant items. Many were related to the care of her dogs such as unsealed wood, lack of sanitization, lack of proper shelters. Many were also for violations regarding the incident with the bear. Ms Briscoe had no Program of Veterinary Care. She had a sheet signed that stated the vet had been out in May of 2005, but when I asked her what he did when he was out she said he did Coggins tests on the horses and that was it. She had been given some 150mg Phenobarbital tablets by the veterinarian in case she needed to knock the bears down with, but these pills would have taken quite some time to become effective. I asked Ms Briscoe why she didn't try using the pills, or calling her vet for assistance when she noticed the bear was out. She said that she just didn't think about it. I visited her attending veterinarian a Dr (B)(6), (B)(7)(c) with the Flora Veterinary Clinic to ask if he even had equipment to use in darting down bears. He said that the clinic did not own a dart gun, nor did the county sheriff's department. I asked him when the last time he had seen the bears, and he said that he saw them 9 years ago when she first got them and didn't even realize that she still had them. As a result there would have been no plausible way to dart down any animal had it escaped from an enclosure, it would have had to have

been fed pills of some sort. I asked her why she decided to open the perimeter to go in after the bear when she knew they had been in a bad mood earlier that day. She had no response to this. Her perimeter fence that was surrounding the bears was only a 6' tall fence and there were several sections where it had detached from the poles and was bowing out. It also was never locked with a padlock of some sort. The gate was usually just wired shut she said. I asked her how she thought the bear got out, to which she said that the bear had chewed a hole in the fence so that is how she thought he escaped. I went to the pen and measured the holes that were in the fence, and have included photos on a CD of those areas. The enclosure walls were also very bowed outward, and there were 2 areas where the bottom of the pen had become detached at corners allowing the fence to be pulled outward.

I did talk to the officers that were on the scene from the Sheriff's department. I asked if they had ever received training on the proper euthanasia of animals with a gun... They had not received any training, but knew that they shouldn't shoot an animal in the head because it was needed for rabies testing. They also said that they didn't realize that Ms Briscoe still had the bears at her facility till the day of the incident. They will not be charging her with any penalties because they think that what happened was just a bad accident.

When I went back to do an exit interview with Ms Briscoe on 2/8/06, I started to explain to her the items that we had discussed the day before. At this point her son drove quickly up the driveway and came into the house with a friend. He started questioning me about why they had had no problems for the entire time they had been licensed but then I had come in the day before and really upset his mother. I explained to him that all the regulations were in the Animal Welfare Act booklet and that even if the previous inspector hadn't explained them to them that they could have read it in there. He also wanted to know why no one ever told them they had to have an escape plan. I told him that while we didn't require one, the ownership of possibly dangerous animals alone would usually cause an owner to have some sort of plan in place. He was very angry that his mother was receiving all of these citations for problems that had never been pointed out before. Ms Briscoe then signed the inspection report and said that she didn't think that she would be able to get all that I asked done, and wanted to give up her license. I told her that if she gave up her license that there would still be an investigation and that she would not be able to sell her camels. I advised her to wait to give it up until after she had sold her camels. I gave her a cancellation form and told her that when she was ready that she needed to send it in to the Regional office. I explained to her that I would likely be back soon and an investigator would probably come with to get a statement.

I feel that this entire incident could have been prevented. The bear that had escaped from its enclosure was still within the perimeter fence. Although the perimeter fence was not up to standards it still would have probably contained the bear long enough for someone to tranquilize the animal and move it safely into its enclosure. I think that opening the perimeter fence and sending an inexperienced elderly gentleman in to lure the bear back into its enclosure was a very poor choice of judgment. This elderly gentleman probably had slowed reflexes due to his age, and due to the weather conditions the ground was very muddy which would have hampered him even more. It is a possibility that he slipped in the mud at some point which triggered the bear to think that he was prey. Either way this man was not a trained handler of bears and had no prior experience handling them, and as a direct result of the licensee's decisions that day he died as did both of the bears.



Investigator (b)(6), (b)(7)c showed me the pictures and inspection reports showing areas on my property that were not in compliance with USDA regulations as it pertained to the welfare of the animals I kept. I no-longer have my USDA Individual license to breed certain animals, such as camels, goats, sheep, limas and wallabies. I don't intend to renew or obtain another license. When the inspector was here she wrote everything down on a piece of paper and left it for me to read.

All of the shelters used by the dogs were only used part time so I didn't see a need to replace the shelters for the dogs. The Animal Care Inspector came to my property the day after the funeral of (b)(6), (b)(7)c I didn't have the animal enclosures cleaned. They are normally cleaned every day. The oil tank being used for the shelter of the big dogs was used because they are excellent for housing the dogs. I didn't know that I couldn't use them. I am still using one of the tanks as a

The bears that I had were raised on my property since they were three days old. I purchased them from a local breeder. On the day of the incident the bears were nervous because they couldn't hibernate. Buddy one of the bears I believed pushed the bottom of the fence out and crawled through to the second enclosure. (b)(6), (b)(7)c was my neighbor. He was my helper when ever I needed help. He came over and tried to coax Buddy back into his pin. (b)(6), (b)(7)c had dog food in his hand and the bear wanted it. Buddy got excited and attacked (b)(6), (b)(7)c I did everything I could at that time to coax the bear to me but the bear wouldn't come. I called 911 and asked for the Sheriff and an ambulance.
