Agency employees conducted a thorough search of their files and the enclosed CD-ROM contains 146 pages of responsive records to your request. However, information has been withheld under FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). This exemption protects information from disclosure when its release would cause a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The release of this information will not shed any light on Government operations. Specifically, we have withheld the names of employees or representatives of the private company or exhibitors; and private home residence. The owners' names have been released.
