2.40(b) Each dealer or exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include: (2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care;

*The following medications were past the expiration date: Xylazine- 08/06, Metacam suspension- 09/06, bottle of TMS tablets-09/06, bottle of Carprofen Tabs- 03/06. These medications were intermingled with other pharmaceuticals that are currently being used at the facility and are therefore ready for use. The licensee must ensure that all medications used in the facility are not expired and labeled properly in accordance with standard veterinary practices and manufacturer's recommendations.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

3.125(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

* The buried chain-link fence along the perimeter fence of the sloth bear enclosure is exposed with areas of excavation along a 10 foot section as well as along the concrete slab of the bear shelter. The licensee must repair or replace fencing so that the enclosures are structurally sound and it shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals securely. This affects 2 animals.

3.125 (c) Storage. Supplies of food and bedding shall be stored in facilities which adequately protect such supplies against deterioration, molding, or contamination by vermin. Refrigeration shall be provided for supplies of perishable food.
