PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

(a) General requirements. (2) Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they: (i) Have no sharp points or edges that could injure the dogs and cats;

The pipe at the bottom of a chain link gate has rusted to the point that it is broken and has sharp edges that could injure the dog. The licensee must repair or replace this area and develop a system of monitoring and maintenance to ensure that all enclosures are constructed and maintained so that they have no sharp edges or points.

3.6 (c) (1) (i)

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

(c) Additional requirements for dogs--(1) Space. (i) Each dog housed in a primary enclosure (including weaned puppies) must be provided a minimum amount of floor space, calculated as follows: Find the mathematical square of the sum of the length of the dog in inches (measured from the tip of its nose to the base of its tail) plus 6 inches; then divide the product by 144. The calculation is: (length of dog in inches + 6) x (length of dog in inches + 6) = required floor space in square inches. Required floor space in inches/144 = required floor space in square feet.

Four hound dogs were housed in a 51.5 by 90 inch enclosure, providing 4635 square inches of floor spaces. One of the dogs measured 35 inches long, requiring a minimum of 1681 square inches. Altogether, these 4 dogs require a minimum of 6724 square inches. Dogs must be housed in enclosures that have adequate space in order to ensure that they have freedom of movement for their health and well being. The licensee must ensure that all dogs are housed in enclosures that provide adequate floor space at all times.

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

(c) Housekeeping for premises. Premises where housing facilities are located, including buildings and surrounding grounds, must be kept clean and in good repair to protect the animals from injury, to facilitate the husbandry practices required in this subpart, and to reduce or eliminate breeding and living areas for rodents and other pests and vermin. Premises must be kept free of accumulations of trash, junk, waste products, and discarded matter. Weeds, grasses, and bushes must be controlled so as to facilitate cleaning of the premises and pest control, and to protect the health and well-being of the animals.

An excessive accumulation of dusty cobwebs is present on the rafters, walls, and ceiling inside the kennel building. Buildings must be kept clean in order to eliminate breeding/living areas for pests and to protect the health of the animals. The licensee must clean these areas and ensure that all premises, including building and surrounding grounds, are kept clean and in good repair at all times.

TIME AND METHOD OF IDENTIFICATION.

(a) A class "A" dealer (breeder) shall identify all live dogs and cats on the premises as follows: (1) All live dogs and cats held on the premises, purchased, or otherwise acquired, sold or otherwise disposed of, or removed from the premises for delivery to a research facility or exhibitor or to another dealer, or for sale, through an auction sale or to any person for use as a pet, shall be identified by an official tag of the type described in Sec. 2.51 affixed to the animal's neck by means of a collar made of material generally considered acceptable to pet owners as a means of identifying their pet dogs or cats (2), or shall be identified by a distinctive and legible tattoo marking acceptable to and approved by the Administrator.

Six adult dogs did not have official identification. The facility uses collars with tags, but these dogs' collars and/or tags were missing or hanging on the enclosure gate. All dogs must wear official identification at all times in order to ensure that their identity can be known with certainty and in order to facilitate the record keeping requirements. The licensee must ensure that all dogs have official identification at all times. Dogs can be identified by wearing a collar with a tag containing the required information (the letters "USDA", the facility license number, and the individual dog number) or by a tattoo.

SHELTERED HOUSING FACILITIES.

(a) Heating, cooling, and temperature. The sheltered part of sheltered housing facilities for dogs and cats must be sufficiently heated and cooled when necessary to protect the dogs and cats from temperature or humidity extremes and to provide for their health and well-being. The ambient temperature in the sheltered part of the facility must not fall below 50 deg. F (10 deg. C) for dogs and cats not acclimated to lower temperatures, for those breeds that cannot tolerate lower temperatures without stress and discomfort (such as short-haired breeds), and for sick, aged, young, or infirm dogs or cats, except as approved by the attending veterinarian. Dry bedding, solid resting boards, or other methods of conserving body heat must be provided when temperatures are below 50 deg. F (10 deg. C). The ambient temperature must not fall below 45 deg. F (7.2 deg. C) for more than 4 consecutive hours when dogs or cats are present, and must not rise above 85 deg. F (29.5 deg. C) for more than 4 consecutive hours when dogs or cats are present. The preceding requirements are in addition to, not in place of, all other requirements pertaining to climatic conditions in parts 2 and 3 of this chapter.

The kennel building was 39.8 degrees inside at the time of the inspection as measured by the inspector's Kestrel weather station. The kennel building was currently being used to house 10 dogs, including one dog that was under medical treatment for being very thin. The building does not have a working heat source. Weather.com stated that on the day of the inspection the high in the area was 16 degrees F and the low was negative 6 degrees F. Appropriate temperatures must be maintained in the kennel facility in order to protect the health and well-being of the animals. The licensee must ensure that temperatures in the kennel building do not fall below 50 deg. F (10 deg. C) for dogs and cats not acclimated to lower temperatures, for those breeds that cannot tolerate lower temperatures without stress and discomfort (such as short-haired breeds), and for sick, aged, young, or infirm dogs or cats, except as approved by the attending veterinarian and that the ambient temperature does not fall below 45 deg. F (7.2 deg. C) for more than 4 consecutive hours when dogs or cats are present and does not rise above 85 deg. F (29.5 deg. C) for more than 4 consecutive hours when dogs or cats are present.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES USED TO TRANSPORT LIVE DOGS AND CATS.

a) Construction of primary enclosures. The dog or cat must be contained in a primary enclosure such as a compartment, transport cage, carton, or crate. Primary enclosures used to transport dogs and cats must be constructed so that: (1) The primary enclosure is strong enough to contain the dogs and cats securely and comfortably and to withstand the normal rigors of transportation.

One crate, containing 2 dogs, was no longer structurally sound; the seam between the top and bottom pieces was gaping approximately 1 inch. Another crate, containing 2 dogs, was being held together with pieces of twisted wire that had broken, untwisted, and/or rusted to the point that they no longer can reliably hold the enclosure together and withstand the rigors of transportation. All primary enclosures for transportation must be strong enough to securely and comfortably contain the dogs in order to protect them from injury. The licensee must ensure that all primary enclosures used for transport are strong enough to contain the dogs and cats securely and comfortably and to withstand the normal rigors of transportation at all times.

(a) Construction of primary enclosures. The dog or cat must be contained in a primary enclosure such as a compartment, transport cage, carton, or crate. Primary enclosures used to transport dogs and cats must be constructed so that: (6) Unless the enclosure is permanently affixed to the conveyance, it is clearly marked on top and on one or more sides with the words "Live Animals," in letters at least 1 inch (2.5 cm.) high, and with arrows or other markings to indicate the correct upright position of the primary enclosure;

At the time of the inspection, the licensee had 20 dogs and 8 cats loaded into a van for transportation. None of the crates containing the animals were marked with the words "Live Animals" or arrows indicating the correct positioning of the crate. Transportation cages must be labeled appropriately in order to ensure that handlers know how to position the crates in the correct orientation in order to prevent the animals from becoming injured or distressed. The licensee must ensure that all transportation enclosures are clearly labeled on the top and one or more sides with the words "Live Animals" (in letters at least 1 inch high) and with arrows or other markings to indicate the correct upright position of the enclosure.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES USED TO TRANSPORT LIVE DOGS AND CATS.

(b) Cleaning of primary enclosures. A primary enclosure used to hold or transport dogs or cats in commerce must be cleaned and sanitized before each use in accordance with the methods provided in Sec. 3.11(b)(3) of this subpart. If the dogs or cats are in transit for more than 24 hours, the enclosures must be cleaned and any litter replaced, or other methods, such as moving the animals to another enclosure, must be utilized to prevent the soiling of the dogs or cats by body wastes. If it becomes necessary to remove the dog or cat from the enclosure in order to clean, or to move the dog or cat to another enclosure, this procedure must be completed in a way that safeguards the dog or cat from injury and prevents escape.

An enclosure housing two hound dogs (identification numbers 2472 and 2490) had a chunk of straw with frozen brown material against the side of the pen and brownish colored moist material on the interior top surface of the enclosure. The licensee stated he was unable to clean the enclosure prior to loading the animals, as the material was frozen. Transport enclosures must be cleaned and sanitized prior to each use in order to protect the health of the animals and prevent disease transmission. The licensee must ensure that all primary enclosures used for transport are cleaned and sanitized before each use.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES USED TO TRANSPORT LIVE DOGS AND CATS.

(e) Space and placement. (1) Primary enclosures used to transport live dogs and cats must be large enough to ensure that each animal contained in the primary enclosure has enough space to turn about normally while standing, to stand and sit erect, and to lie in a natural position.

At least 5 crates, containing a total of 10 dogs, were too small to allow each dog inside to turn about normally while standing and lie in a natural position. The inspector observed that some of the dogs could not lay down with out laying partially on top of each other. These crates, each containing two dogs, were approximately 31 inches long, 20 inches wide, and 28 inches high. A large sheepdog that looked like a Great Pyrenees was in a crate that the licensee stated does not allow it to stand and sit in a normal position. Inspectors were unable to measure the dogs, as the licensee stated that they might escape. Due to the positioning of the crates in the van, the inspectors were unable to measure all of the crates. Transport enclosures must be large enough to allow each dog inside of them to make normal postural adjustments in order to protect their health and well-being. The licensee must ensure that all transport enclosures are large enough to provide sufficient space for each animal to turn about normally while standing, to stand and sit erect, and to lie in a natural position.

PRIMARY CONVEYANCES (MOTOR VEHICLE, RAIL, AIR, AND MARINE).

(f) Primary enclosures must be positioned in the primary conveyance in a manner that allows the dogs and cats to be quickly and easily removed from the primary conveyance in an emergency.

The transportation van was loaded with crates containing a total of 20 dogs and 8 cats in a manner that does not allow the dogs and cats to be quickly and easily removed from the van in the event of an emergency. The crate on the top row of cages that can be visualized from the side door, was not easily accessible. When the inspectors wanted to view the animals, the licensee could only partially rotate the cage to expose the door to allow a limited view of the animals and could not remove the crate without unloading all of the crates in the back of the van. Cages in the interior portion of the van could not be visualized or easily removed from the van as they were blocked in and surrounded on all sides by other enclosures. Transport enclosure must be positioned in a manner that allows the animals to be quickly and easily removed in the event of an emergency in order to protect the health of the animals. The licensee must ensure that all transport enclosures are positioned in the primary conveyance in a manner that allows the dogs and cats to be quickly and easily removed from the primary conveyance in an emergency.

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

(b) Each dealer or exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include: (2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care;

Both of the dogs in pen 6 were in need of medical attention. A large pile of abnormal excreta was in the corner of the enclosure that resembled regurgitated food material; it was approximately 6 by 6 inches and had a chunky appearance and was brown and moist.

1. One dog (black and tan coon hound, ID#2054) was standing with its head down and rocking in an abnormal manner from front to back and side to side. The dog did not move or look around in a normal manner and had dull eyes. The dog never lifted its head into a normal position. This dog was very thin with very prominent, easily visible bony structures including its hips, backbone, and shoulder structures. The dog's abdomen was extremely tucked and its hair coat was dull.

2. The second dog (blue tick hound, ID#2055) was also standing in an abnormal manner and rocking from front to back. This dog was also very thin with a prominent rib cage. The dog's abdomen was extremely tucked and it had a dull hair coat. The dog's eyes had a dull appearance; a yellow to green discharge was present in both eyes, which can occur as the result of infection, injury, or other medical conditions.

The licensee stated that he had treated the animals with injectable penicillin for two days with no improvement in condition, but he had not had the animals examined by a veterinarian. The abnormal behaviors displayed by these animals could occur as the result of infectious diseases, injuries, or other medical conditions.

A male tri-color hound male dog (ID#2057, pen 9) was non-weight bearing on his left hind leg. An area of hair loss that was approximately 1 inch by 1/2 inch was present above the central pad on the dog's left hind leg. The skin had a reddened and roughened appearance. This dog was also very thin with prominent bony structures including its backbone, hips, ribs, and shoulder structures. It had an extremely tucked abdomen and a dull hair coat.

Three additional dogs were identified that were underweight. Dogs may become excessively thin due to intestinal parasites, malnutrition, or other medical conditions.

1. A female hound dog (ID#2031, pen 11): Very thin with prominent ribs, hips, and back bone; extremely tucked abdomen.
2. A red, male hound dog (ID#2046, pen 10): Very thin with a prominent rib cage, back bone and an extremely tucked abdomen. A white discharge was present in both of his eyes.
3. A male tri-color hound (ID#2038, pen 4): Very thin with a prominent back bone, ribs, hips, and bones in its legs. The dog had an extremely tucked abdomen and a dull hair coat. The licensee stated that the dog was a "heartwormer".

All of the above listed animals must be examined by a veterinarian in order to ensure that the animals receive accurate diagnoses and appropriate treatment plans. Licensee must document the outcome of this visit and provide it to the inspector upon request.

The licensee must establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include the use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases/injuries at all times in order to protect the health and well-being of the animals.

This is a repeat non-compliant item. It was also not in compliance on October 28, 2008 and February 17, 2009.

3.1 (a)

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structure; construction. Housing facilities for dogs and cats must be designed and constructed so that they are structurally sound. They must be kept in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injury, contain the animals securely, and restrict other animals from entering.

The wooden resting platform in an enclosure housing one adult cat (ID#2042) was broken. All of the cat's weight was resting over the cracked, uneven surface. Housing facilities for cats must be structurally sound and kept in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury. The licensee must develop a program of monitoring and maintenance to ensure that all housing facilities for dogs and cats are structurally sound, kept in good repair, and protect the animals from injury, contain the animals securely, and restrict other animals from entering at all times.

The licensee corrected the non-compliant item at the time of the inspection.

A strong odor was present at the entrance of the kennel due to a large accumulation of chicken droppings. An excessive accumulation of discarded materials was present around the kennel building. Discarded materials included at least 32 "pet-taxi" style animal crates, 17 bird enclosures, and 4 research style metal cages. Other materials included pipes, gutters, a shovel, and a ladder. Standing water had accumulated inside several of these items. An accumulation of old moist dog food was present on the ground. They sores were open with a roughened surface and were black/gray in color. The skin around the edges of the sores was thickened in appearance. The animal had not received any medical attention and a veterinarian had not been consulted.

These three animals must be examined by a veterinarian by Friday in order to ensure that an accurate diagnosis and appropriate treatment plan are developed. Licensee must document the outcome of this visit and provide it to the inspector upon request.

A male tri-colored, long haired dog (Tag #1576) was observed with excessive matting of the hair coat on his chest, sides and the backs of his legs.
