Enclosed you will find the conference agenda. There may be some slight changes to the time slots between now and the conference but the content should remain the same.





Subject WS wolf predation management in ID

Hello Ron:

I wanted to share the ID Wildlife Services (WS) program's annual report of wolf predation management activities it was involved with in Federal Fiscal year 2009. While the ID wolf population and conflict levels are certainly much greater than Oregon's I think you will find the information on trends in livestock depredation, predation management strategies both lethal and non-lethal employed now and recommended in the future to be of interest. The report also has a WS Depredation Investigation Report Form (WS 200) which has been used by WS in AZ/NM/WY/MT/ID (I also think it is being used in the Great Lakes States) for as long as wolf re colonization or reintroduction has been going on. This form has been used by WS to share information with the USFWS and state agencies and it recognized by the Defenders of Wildlife (DOW) as an acceptable form for WS to document wolf depredation for livestock producers who can use a copy of the form and seek compensation for wolf predation from DOW. I have mentioned this form to you in the past as a possible format that we could use in our investigations of alleged wolf predation which ODFW and /or livestock producers could recognize and use to document depredation events and use in compensation programs.

Given the USFWS funding that has just been made available to by the USFWS to the states for proactive nonlethal wolf predation and compensation I thought you would like to see this form and consider its use in Oregon since this form is recognized in several states in the western USA. Would ODFW consider compensating WS here in Oregon for fulfilling a role of investigating reported wolf predation, making a determination of whether wolves were confirmed/probable/possible or unknown/not involved-other and use the WS 200 form to provide documentation to ODFW and producers? Yes, the request is for some funding but I thought the concept should be considered during the revision of the Oregon Wolf Plan which may incorporate the new funding from USFWS. Wolves will become more numerous over time and the timely investigation of reported wolf kills is critical to wolf management.

While on the topic of wolves:

- I heard that ODFW has made a receiver available to our Wallowa County Wildlife Specialist. We appreciate this. We will use it to help make decisions on what control tools to deploy how to deploy the control tools based on good information on where known wolves are. We will document the telemetry locations of the known packs and provide them to Russ Morgan to add to his database so we can draw tighter polygons on the map to identify occupied wolf areas. As you realize this can help us avoid take of wolves while deploying predator control tools to manage predation caused by other predators as effectively and efficiently as we can. This leads me to ask if Russ has forwarded our questions about our Incidental Take Permit that he said he needed to consult with you on?
