#### FEEDING.

The food shall be wholesome, palatable, and free from contamination and of sufficient quantity and nutritive value to maintain all animals in good health. The diet shall be prepared with consideration for the age, species, condition, size, and type of the animal.

\*\*\*Two female yearling grizzly bear cubs appeared underweight and had rough hair coats. Weight was estimated at approximately 80- 100 lbs. each. Current diet consists of 1.5 cups of dry dog food (10% protein) and one loaf of bread per day. According to dog food label, even a 100 lb. dog would need 4-6 cups of dog food/day. The current diet is not adequate to maintain the nutritional needs of young growing bears. Need to increase the amount and quality of food for these bears. Correct by May 15,2011.

**3.125 (a) REPEAT**  
**FACILITIES, GENERAL.**

(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

The following facility items are no longer structurally sound nor in good repair:

\*The roof over the public walkways and extending over the outdoor bear enclosures is disintegrating in many places. In several places the material has become completely water soaked and torn leading to loose strips/pieces of roofing material hanging over the bear dens. If these pieces fall into the dens, they may be chewed upon or eaten by the bears.

\*The doorframe between the outdoor enclosure and den of the single housed male grizzly bear has one lower corner rusted through exposing sharp edges and the other outer side wood frame is rotten.

\*The right side of the upper arch of the shelter in the outdoor pen housing the cinnamon bear and black bear has a large crack running along the entire length. The crack is large enough to allow daylight to be visible through it. This type of crack will lead to structural instability.

\*The outdoor enclosure housing one young black bear has a column from which a large portion of the lowest section of concrete has crumbled away.

\*The waterfall in the enclosure housing the asian bears has a water leak problem with water seeping through the retaining wall instead of entering the actual waterfall. The side of the wall is wet and has pieces of concrete rock crumbling away.

Lack of structural soundness and maintaining the facility in good repair can lead to injury of the bears. All facilities must be kept in good repair to protect the animals.

**3.126** (c)

**FACILITIES, INDOOR.**

(c) Lighting. Indoor housing facilities shall have ample lighting, by natural or artificial means, or both, of good quality, distribution, and duration as appropriate for the species involved. Such lighting shall be uniformly distributed and of sufficient intensity to permit routine inspection and cleaning. Lighting of primary enclosures shall be designed to protect the animals from excessive illumination.

The indoor dens housing the bears are very dark. Some of the dens have a light fixture, others do not. Even those with light fixtures are not fully illuminated in all parts of the den. The hallway light fixtures also do not work--some had burned out bulbs. Adequate lighting is necessary to allow the animals to be observed daily and to allow inspection of the den. Indoor housing shall have ample lighting of good quality and distribution to permit routine inspection and cleaning. Correct by Mar. 31, 2011.

**SANITATION.**

(c) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart. Accumulations of trash shall be placed in designated areas and cleared as necessary to protect the health of the animals.

The outdoor enclosure housing one young black bear has stale, trampled-on bread on the ground. A pile of stool was next to the bread. Food waste/food not eaten in a timely manner needs to be removed from the enclosure to avoid intestinal problems. The enclosure shall be kept clean of all trash and food waste. Correct by Mar. 4, 2011.
