(b) Shelter from the elements. Outdoor housing facilities for nonhuman primates must provide adequate shelter from the elements at all times. It must provide protection from the sun,....

\*\*\*\*There was no shade covering to provide protection from the sun where three of the barbary apes are held in the "back section" of the compound. The temperature measured at the time was 104 degrees F. Without even adequate protection the animals may suffer from heat related illness. The temperature measured today is not the highest possible for this time of year.

### 3.127 (a)

#### FACILITIES, OUTDOOR.

(a) Shelter from sunlight. When sunlight is likely to cause overheating or discomfort of the animals, sufficient shade by natural or artificial means shall be provided to allow all animals kept outdoors to protect themselves from direct sunlight.

\*\*\*\*There is insufficient shade in the enclosure holding he nine wallabys. Animals were seen lying in a small section of shade cast by a section of fence and others were seen sharing a small shade produced in a corner from the same fence and the hay shed.

\*\*\*\*There is insufficient shade in the enclosure holding six goats, for the petting zoo. The animals were seen under a bridge like structure with their heads and noses in the sun.

As mentioned earlier in this report the temperature was at 104 degrees F. Temperatures of this magnitude alone can easily be the cause of heat related illness without the aid of shade and or a misting system to help in cooling the animals.

### HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(c) Surfaces

(1) General requirements. The surfaces of housing facilities -- including perches, shelves, swings, boxes, houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures or objects within the facility -- must be constructed in a manner and made of materials that allow them to be readily cleaned and sanitized, or removed or replaced when worn or soiled. Floors may be made of dirt, absorbent bedding, sand, gravel, grass, or other similar material that can be readily cleaned, or can be removed or replaced whenever cleaning does not eliminate odors, diseases, pests, insects, or vermin.

(2) Maintenance and replacement of surfaces. All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis. Surfaces of housing facilities -- including houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures and objects within the facility -- that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled.

\*\*\*In the chimp indoor enclosure, the wooden sleeping platform is worn and cracked, there is a mild to moderate amount of peeling paint on the walls where the underlying cement is exposed, and there is a large crack in the cement flooring. Dirt and other debris may collect in these areas and cleaning and sanitizing as required cannot be effectively done. The wooden platform, walls and floor within the enclosures that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled. \*\*\*

**SANITATION.**

?3.131 Sanitation.

(a) Cleaning of enclosures. Excreta shall be removed from primary enclosures as often as necessary to prevent contamination of the animals contained therein and to minimize disease hazards and to reduce odors.

(b) Sanitation of enclosures. Subsequent to the presence of an animal with an infectious or transmissible disease, cages, rooms, and hard-surfaced pens or runs shall be sanitized either by washing them with hot water (180 F. at source) and soap or detergent, as in a mechanical washer, or by washing all soiled surfaces with a detergent solution followed by a safe and effective disinfectant, or by cleaning all soiled surfaces with saturated live steam under pressure.

\*\*\*The wooden den boxes in the cavy , caracal, and a few other animal enclosures are worn and cracked. Dirt and other debris may collect in these areas and cleaning and sanitizing as required cannot be effectively done. The wooden den boxes, and other furniture-type fixtures and objects within the enclosures that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled. \*\*\*

#### ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

One of the agoutis held on the premises had escaped it's primary enclosure and had made it outside the front gate. At the time I left the facility the animal had not yet been captured. The location in the primary enclosure where this animal escaped must be identified and repaired so that all the animals are contained and protected from injury.
