

2.	The flock of origin for the hatching eggs were not vaccinated against any H5 or H7 subtype of avian influenza.					
3.	The flock of origin for the hatching eggs have been vaccinated against Newcastle disease (avian paramyxovirus) at least 21 days prior to export, using vaccines that do not contain any velogenic strains of Newcastle disease virus.

4.	. Canada is recognized by the United States as free from Newcastle Disease.					
5.	. Birds/hatching eggs covered by this certificate do not originate from flocks nor had contact with any birds or poultry originating in a control zone established by federal animal health authorities due to outbreaks of Newcastle disease or Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).					
6.	. The flock of origin of the hatching eggs had no evidence of avian communicable disease within the 30 days prior to the hatching of the first egg laid for this shipment.					
7.	The flock of origin for the hatching eggs were exported from an area that was not adjacent to any areas under quarantine during the 90 days preceding the exportation.					
8.	The flock of origin of the hatching eggs were either born in Canada; or legally imported and then have resided in Canada for at least 90 consecutive days prior to collecting eggs to comprise the shipment.					
9.	. The hatching eggs were placed in new or appropriately sanitized packing containers for shipment to the United States at the premises where the flock of origin was kept.
