Import Requirements for Fig Fruit from Mexico Irradiated in Mexico

- ◆ **Import Permit Required:** An import permit is required. To obtain a permit, go to [e-Permits](#).
- ◆ **Subject to Inspection:** This commodity is subject to inspection at the port of entry and all general requirements of [7CFR 319.56-3](#).
- ◆ **Commercial Consignments Only:**
- ◆ **Condition of Entry Treatment T105-a-1:**
- ◆ **Other: Must** be precleared and irradiated with the specified treatment in compliance with [7CFR 305.9](#) in the country of origin.
- ◆ **Other:** The completed Preclearance Form 203 (yellow or white) or an electronic message signed by the APHIS Inspector in the country of origin confirming application of irradiation treatment **must** be presented at the time of entry.
- ◆ **Other: Do not** import or distribute into Hawaii, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, and Guam.
- ◆ **Phytosanitary Certificate:** Consignments **must** be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued by Sanidad Vegetal with an additional declaration stating that: “The fruit in this consignment was inspected and found free of *Maconellicoccus hirsutus* and *Nipaecoccus viridis*.”
- ◆ The fruit **must** be packed in insect-proof boxes.
