

## Additional Import Requirements for Citrus fruit From Mexico Grown in a Fruit Fly Free Area into All Ports

Citrus from Mexico is admissible into all U.S. ports with the following additional import requirements:

### NOTICE

These additional import requirements are limited to grapefruit (*Citrus paradisi*), tangerine, clementine, mandarin (*C. reticulata*), tangelo (*Citrus x tangelo*), sweet orange (*C. sinensis*), ethrog (*C. medica*).

- ◆ Consignments are allowed entry into all ports.
  - ◆ Consignments must be accompanied by a Mexican phytosanitary certificate (electronic certificates are acceptable) with two additional declarations:
    - ❖ "These regulated articles originated from [an area free from pests](#) as designated in 7 CFR 319.56-5."
- AND
- ❖ "The citrus in this consignment were cleaned using normal packing house procedures."
  - ◆ Boxes must be labeled with the name of the orchard/grove/grower AND the name of the municipality and State in which the fruits were produced.
  - ◆ Fruit must be sealed if they originated in a fruit fly free area but transited an area not listed as fruit fly free.
  - ◆ **AUTHORIZED USERS ONLY:** If the consignment is packed in loose bulk bins, refer to "Special Procedures for loose bulk citrus" in the "Instructions for Officers" section.
