
Additional Import Requirements for Grapefruit (fruit) from Mexico Treated with Methyl Bromide, Vapor Heat, or High Temperature Forced Air into All Ports

- ◆ Consignments are allowed entry into all ports.
- ◆ Consignments must be treated at an APHIS-approved facility in Mexico.
- ◆ Consignments must be precleared and accompanied by a completed PPQ Form 203 (yellow or white) or an electronic message signed by the APHIS inspector in Mexico confirming treatment.
- ◆ Consignments must be accompanied with a phytosanitary certificate (PC) issued by Sanidad Vegetal with an additional declaration (AD) stating that "The citrus in this consignment were cleaned using normal packing house procedures."
- ◆ Each box must be marked with the statement "USDA APHIS treated with methyl bromide (if T101-j-2-1), or vapor heat (if T106-a-2), or high temperature forced air (T103-a-1). "
- ◆ Consignments must be tarped with a suitable cover to prevent reinfestation during movement from packing facilities to the border.
