

## Import Requirements for Mango Fruit from Mexico Irradiated in Mexico Arriving into All U.S. Ports

1. **Import Permit Required:** An import permit is required. To obtain a permit, go to [e-Permits](#).
2. **Subject to Inspection:** This commodity is subject to inspection at the port of entry and all general requirements of [7CFR 319.56-3](#).
3. **Commercial Consignments Only:**
4. **Condition of Entry Treatment T105-a-1:**
5. **Must** be precleared and irradiated with the specified treatment in compliance with [7CFR 305.9](#) in the country of origin.
6. The completed Preclearance Form 203 (yellow or white) or an electronic message signed by the APHIS Inspector in the country of origin confirming application of irradiation treatment **must** be presented at the time of entry.
7. **Phytosanitary Certificate:** Consignments **must** be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued by the NPPO of Mexico.
8. The fruit **must** be packed in insect-proof boxes.
9. **Other:** For box, carton, and pallet labeling requirements, refer to [Packaging Requirements for Irradiated Commodities](#).
10. **AUTHORIZED USERS ONLY:** Refer to the [Special Procedures for Irradiated Fruits and Vegetables](#) in the “Instructions for Officers” section.
