LOOK FOR THE SIGNS YOU CAN SEE THE ADULT ALB FROM JUNE THROUGH OCTOBER, BUT YOU CAN SPOT THE SIGNS YEAR-ROUND.

 Round exit hole	 Adult beetle
 Fras (sawdust-like material)	 Egg sites on bark
 Pupae in chopped wood	 Larvae in chopped wood

HOW TO CHECK YOUR TREES:

- Take 10 minutes
- Look for signs of the beetle
- Report any sightings
- August is Tree Check Month
