

## European Grapevine Moth Program

### *Highlights from Industry Call – March 29, 2012*

- EGVM trapping is being conducted in 17 counties in California
  - Napa County – 4100 traps placed to date
    - Mating disruption placed in a total of 23,000 acres
  - Sonoma County – traps being installed; target of 7000 traps for 2012
    - Mating disruption placed in a total of 198 acres

### *Highlights from Industry Call – April 26, 2012*

- USDA received official notice from Mexico acknowledging the eradication of *Lobesia botrana* (EGVM) from the Counties of Fresno, Mendocino, Merced, and San Joaquin in the State of California
- 25, 276 EGVM traps placed and maintained in 17 counties in California
  - Napa County – 5,000 traps placed and maintained
    - Mating disruption up within 500 meters of an EGVM find
    - Grower liaisons working with industry groups to get information to growers for first generation treatments
    - Three male moths detected in a total of two traps during the week of April 23<sup>rd</sup>
  - Solano County – traps are placed; first generation treatments will begin soon
  - Sonoma County – 7,900 traps placed and maintained

### *Highlights from Industry Call – May 31, 2012*

- USDA responded to requests from Canada and Mexico for information supporting removal of *Rubus* species from the EGVM host list
- First flight of EGVM is nearing completion
  - Grower treatments are ongoing
  - Number of detections decreased from 96 moths in 2011 to 66 moths

Detections to date: 66

### *Highlights from Industry Call – June 28, 2012*

- EGVM Technical Working Group is evaluating the EGVM host list to determine if any plant species may be removed
- First flight of EGVM is completed
  - CDFA began residential and urban treatments in Sonoma and Santa Clara counties
  - EGVM detections in Napa County decreased from 96 moths in 2011 to 77 moths
  - To date, EGVM has not been detected in Nevada, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, and Sonoma counties

Detections to date: 77

### *Highlights from Industry Call – September 27, 2012*

- EGVM Technical Working Group will meet in Sacramento, California in late October
- All three flights of EGVM completed
  - EGVM was not been detected in Nevada, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, and Sonoma counties
  - EGVM detections in Napa County decreased from 96 moths in 2011 to 77 moths in 2012
