

## **European Grapevine Moth Program**

### *Highlights from Industry Call – May 20, 2014*

- EGVM trapping is being conducted in 22 counties in California
  - Napa County – 11,400 traps placed to date
    - Ongoing outreach with grape industry
  - California Department of Food and Agriculture continuing urban residential treatments
    - This includes: mating disruption, Bt treatments, host removal

### *Highlights from Industry Call – June 17, 2014*

- San Joaquin County – 4,500 traps placed to date
- California Department of Food and Agriculture - 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of *Bt* treatment to begin June 30

### *Highlights from Industry Call – July 15, 2014*

- Sonoma County – 1 male moth trapped at an isolated vineyard near Cazadero. Delimitation trapping over approximately 85 acres; after 2 weeks of trapping and on-site surveys, no subsequent finds.
- California Department of Food and Agriculture – Activities are on-track; 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of *Bt* treatment completed, host removal is ongoing
- Trade discussions – Canada had posted their draft EGVM Directive for public comment. The comment period is now closed and Canada is reviewing the comments.

### *Highlights from Industry Call – August 19, 2014*

- Trade discussions – Discussions continue with Canada on EGVM regulations, particularly on the re-export of items coming into the U.S.
- Non-quarantine areas - trapping has finished for the season and traps are being taken down. Quarantine areas - trapping will continue until the end of September.
- Treatment – high rate of compliance among growers
- End of 2<sup>nd</sup> Flight – on/about 8/15.
- Technical Working Group – reviewing trapping data and other information in reference to the request to modify (reduce) regulated area. Recommendation is pending.

### **Highlights from Industry Call – September 16, 2014**

- Revised Federal Order released about 35% of Quarantined area from regulation, including the remaining portion of Solano County and portions of Napa and Sonoma Counties.
- Trade discussions – Discussions continue with Canada on EGVM regulations, particularly on the re-export of items coming into the U.S.
- Quarantine areas - trapping will continue until the end of September.

- Field treatments have been completed for the year.
- Napa County reported 100% compliance with the growers for treatments.
- CPHST is collaborating with researchers in Portugal on enhanced detection methods; results will be reported/published when trials are complete.
- 2014 EGVM Program and Technical Working Group Discussion (webinar) is scheduled for Wednesday, October 22, 2014 from 1-3pm (ET)
