Notice: Pet Supplements Exported to Canada

As of June 24, 2024, Thermally Processed pet supplements can be exported to Canada using the <u>Veterinary Export Certificate for Thermally Processed</u> Pet Food Products Containing Animal-Origin Ingredients Exported from the United States of America to Canada (249 KB).

The facility manufacturing the pet supplements must be under APHIS inspection, if the facility has a current APHIS facility number and has been inspected for thermally processed pet food products (pet food, pet treats, compound chews), no additional action is needed. If the facility producing the pet supplements is not currently under APHIS inspection for export to Canada, then the facility should contact their <u>VS Field Office</u> covering the area in which the product is manufactured to obtain pre-inspection documents verify they meet the requirements, and schedule an inspection.

As of July 23, 2024, supplements manufactured in and exported from the United States, packaged for retail sale, that contain **fish oil** as the **only** animal origin ingredient [imported under Canadian tariff codes 15.04.10.8009, 15.04.20.8020.01, or 15.18.00.1421.07] are exempt from this requirement, and do not require a Canadian import permit or a U.S. export certificate.
