USDA can digitally endorse the health certificate and return it electronically.

### **Summary of Requirements**

Chile requires that health certificates and annexes must be signed and stamped by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificates must be written in Spanish and English. The health certificates cannot be amended, initialed, crossed-out or erased, and they must be legible.

**NOTE**: An APHIS-endorsed, printed paper copy **must** accompany the shipment.

Exporters who want to ship livestock or germplasm whose requirements are not listed above should have the importer or buyer in the destination country apply for an import permit at the appropriate ministry.
