Export Live Animals to Hong Kong

USDA-accredited veterinarians can electronically issue health certificates and use VEHCS (Veterinary Export Health Certification System) to submit them to USDA for endorsement.

Digital endorsement varies by species—see requirements on this page for details. The health certificate either bears the original ink signature and embossed seal *or* digital signature/seal.

What This Means for You

Accredited Veterinarians: Use the links below to access or get help with VEHCS. Learn more about how to issue export health certificates.

Animal Owners/Shippers: Digitally endorsed health certificates can be printed out directly from VEHCS. For non-digitally endorsed health certificates, you can arrange

to have your health certificate returned by mail (a prepaid, preaddressed return label must be provided during certificate submission). A paper version of the endorsed health certificate must accompany the animal(s) during shipment or travel.

Summary of Requirements

For Hong Kong importation information, go to Import of Animals and Birds.

For all health certificates submitted through <u>VEHCS</u> for shipments of U.S.-origin animals and germplasm that are only *transiting* Hong Kong, select the **Hong Kong** (**Transit**) option from the "Country of Destination" dropdown menu.

For animals and germplasm that are *destined* for export to Hong Kong, first you must first select **Country Not Listed** from the "Country of Destination" dropdown menu, and then select **Hong Kong** from the full list of destination countries.

All health certificates for export of livestock, poultry, and birds must be issued by a USDA-accredited veterinarian and endorsed by an APHIS Veterinary Medical Officer within 14 days of departure.

Laboratory test reports/results are required for equine entry.

Importers of live swine into Hong Kong must apply for import permit from the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department.

Poultry

For any current restriction on live birds/poultry, check the Temporary Restrictions under the "Reminder" heading at <u>Hong Kong's Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department website</u>. Transit of day-old chicks is exempt for countrywide HPAI bans and require State or compartment freedom per the below posted sample health certificate.

This certificate will be accepted with the use of digital signatures. A health certificate for this commodity can also be generated through the <u>Veterinary Export Health</u> <u>Certificate System (VEHCS)</u>. Once you log on to VEHCS and enter the destination country and commodity, the system will walk you through each step to generate the certificate.

The APHIS Veterinary Medical Officer signature will also be digital with no wet signature or embossed seal; however, a printed paper copy of the endorsed health certificate must accompany each shipment.

Aquaculture/Aquatic Animals

Hong Kong does not have any import requirements for aquatic animals, except for endangered species under CITES. The importation requirements for endangered species, including those aquatic animals, are available at Licensing and Inspection.

Research/Laboratory Animals

Visit Hong Kong's website to learn more about importing these animals.

Health certificates for animals for research and laboratory purposes must be issued by the USDA-accredited veterinarian that is in charge of the research animal colony of origin and endorsed by an APHIS Veterinary Medical Officer within 14 days of departure.

Any GMOs being imported must be accompanied by the GMO Documentation for Import and Export per Hong Kong Regulation, Cap 607A. The GMO documentation does not need to be incorporated into the APHIS-endorsed health certificate or endorsed by APHIS.

Other Animals

Health certificates for the export of commercial shipments of U.S.-origin animals must be issued by a private USDA-accredited veterinarian and endorsed by an APHIS Veterinary Medical Officer within 14 days of departure.

If your species is not listed, the requirements for that species are not known. Exporters who want to ship livestock or germplasm whose requirements are not listed above should have the importer or buyer in the destination country apply for an import permit at the appropriate ministry. This import permit will most likely outline the specific requirements.
