Our endorsement offices can answer questions about issuing export certificates, interpreting regulations and requirements, saving and uploading PDF files, certificate status, payment (user fees), creating and uploading shipping labels, and accreditation. Routine APHIS VEHCS processing services are staffed Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 4:30 PM Central Time (CT) excluding federal holidays, the time listed in VEHCS reflects GMT.

Important Reminder for Pet Dog Certificates

Check whether the dog will be returning to the United States and verify **all** import requirements. There may be requirements that need to be met before leaving the United States in order to return.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is the primary authority for dog imports. For requirements, visit the [CDC website](#).

CDC requires all U.S.-vaccinated dogs that have [traveled to a high-risk country for rabies within the past 6 months](#) to have a "Certification of U.S.-Issued Rabies Vaccination" form. This form must be submitted by a USDA-accredited veterinarian and endorsed **before** the dog leaves the United States.
