# Example 1:

Officer works a scheduled Sunday overtime shift from 0800-1630. The officer takes a 30-minute unpaid lunch break.

The provision for full CTT in conjunction with a scheduled Sunday overtime shift is found in **APHIS Directive 402.3** (46.44 KB), section V, paragraph G., and Attachment 3, paragraph F.2.a.

# Example 7:

Officer is scheduled to work Sunday overtime shift from 0800-1630. Since no additional planes are due until after 1630, officer is sent home at 1430. The officer takes a 30-minute unpaid lunch break. The same officer who was sent home early from scheduled overtime, works the following:

# **Rationale:**

Even though the employee was scheduled to work 0800-1630, with an unpaid 30minute lunch break, his/her tour officially ended upon dismissal at 1430. The employee is compensated for the actual time worked - being guaranteed at least a 2-hour minimum - plus the appropriate CTT as stated in <u>APHIS Directive 402.3</u>, section V, paragraph C. Additional entitlements due under any subsequent call out period are now based upon the 1430 time designating the end of the TOD. Therefore, in accordance with <u>APHIS Directive 402.3</u>, Attachment 2, paragraph A.2., the entitlement for the additional aircraft at 1635 is a 2-hour minimum plus full CTT.
