(WOAH): Epizootic Hematopoietic

and Gyrodactylus salaris.

## <u>Print</u>

Effective November 12, 2024, the United States is officially declared free from three important aquatic animal pathogens: epizootic hematopoietic necrosis virus (EHNV), salmonid alphavirus (SAV), and *Gyrodactylus salaris*. These pathogens are listed by WOAH and are immediately reportable to the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) Veterinary Services.

These country-level freedom declarations were made in alignment with the WOAH criteria as specified in <a href="Chapter 1.4">Chapter 1.4</a>. Aquatic Animal Disease Surveillance of the WOAH Aquatic Code, and affirm APHIS' commitment to ensuring and maintaining healthy aquatic animal populations for domestic use and international trade purposes.
