Taiwan: Animal Health Export Restrictions for U.S. Food Products Intended for Human Consumption

This page lists animal health-related export restrictions on U.S. animal products intended for human consumption. Export certification for these products is coordinated among multiple Federal agencies.

While APHIS attests to the animal health status of the region of origin (such as a U.S. State, county, or town), other Federal agencies, such as USDA's [Food Safety and Inspection Service](#) and [Agricultural Marketing Service](#), endorse and issue the export certificates.

Products listed on this page may also be subject to additional entry requirements imposed by USDA or other Federal agencies. Exporters are encouraged to consult all relevant authorities to ensure full compliance.

Eggs and Egg Products

Restrictions apply to eggs and egg products (a) produced within the affected area on or before the effective date or (b) loaded onboard vessels on or after the effective date, as indicated below.

These products are ineligible for export to Taiwan due to avian influenza.

Before shipment, we recommend exporters work with their Taiwanese importers to ensure that (1) their export documentation is appropriate, including demonstrating secure transport; and (2) their product is eligible to export to Taiwan.

* Restrictions may not apply to dried egg products.

Poultry and Poultry Products

These restrictions apply to all heat-treated, cooked, fresh, or frozen poultry and poultry products derived from birds slaughtered or processed within the affected area during the dates indicated.

These products are ineligible for export to Taiwan due to avian influenza.

For poultry products to be eligible for export to Taiwan, only live poultry from HPAI-free States are allowed to be moved to a State where the poultry will be slaughtered and, at the time of slaughter, this State must be free of HPAI.

Before shipment, we recommend exporters work with their Taiwanese importers to ensure that (1) their export documentation is appropriate, including demonstrating secure transport; and (2) their product is eligible to export to Taiwan.
